26th Sunday in Ordinary Time 29th September 2019



In the First Reading the prophet Amos speaks forcefully to those who enjoy a life of luxury and leisure but ignore what is happening in the world around them. He tells them that God deplores the way they are living.

The Psalm is a hymn of praise to the Lord who is on the side of those who are oppressed, who gives food to the hungry and sets prisoners free, who raises up those who are bowed down. In our day, we can help to fulfil these promises for those in need.

Paul encourages Timothy to live as a man dedicated to God should live (Second Reading). By doing so he will be a witness for Jesus, speaking up for the truth.

The Gospel story illustrates how those who want to follow God's values must take care of the poor and those in need. Jesus points out to his hearers that he is not saying anything that Moses and the prophets have not already told them.

Our life of faith cannot be reduced to following a set of rules. Rather our Christianity must give thought to the fact it depends on a relationship. This message of justice and hope for an equal share of the world's goods for everyone is strong in the gospel of Jesus. His heart was on fire with the hope of a better life for the poor. He went to help them simply because they were poor.

The Christian Church, being faithful to the gospel, should be involved in many ways in the creation of a more just world. Parishes should take special care for the refugee, the new poor, the unborn, the elderly, and in fact all whose voices may not be usually heard. The parable is meant to make us as aware of the huge inequalities that exist in our world, and in the exploitation of resources in the developing world. This week we pray to live even more faithfully as Jesus's disciples. *Pathways to God Sean Goan 2019*

SOCIAL JUSTICE **SUNDAY**

The Australian Catholic Bishops' Social Justice Statement for 2019 - 2020, Making it Real: Genuine human encounter in our digital world. affirms the positive possibilities for encounter and solidarity offered by new digital media, while warning of those elements of our digital world that may be harmful. These include

information overload; social isolation; marginalisation of the vulnerable; consumerism and fake news. The Statement reminds us that the new digital media cannot be seen as neutral or 'unaffected by any moral considerations'.

While many users do not realise it, the core business of social media platforms is to sell advertising and maximise profits. People's personal lives may be reduced to data that is traded for profit or power, and it is used to target and influence us in ways previously unthinkable. Pushing users to more extreme positions and promoting fake news and conspiracy theories sells, but this is at odds with human solidarity.

The Statement amplifies Pope Francis' call to us to 'boldly become citizens of the digital world', with the image of the Good Samaritan as our inspiration. We are called not only to love our neighbour, but to bring the love of God to the new global neighbourhood. The Statement points out that we are called not just to be inhabitants of this new digital world, but active citizens shaping it. All of us - whether we are users, communities, industrial or political leaders - have a role to play in rejecting hatred, divisions and falsehoods.

We have a duty to foster a neighbourhood that promotes those human attributes and social values that lend themselves to genuine human encounter love, understanding, beauty, goodness, truth and trustworthiness, joy and hope.

Let's Listen & Discern



Plenary Council president Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB says the involvement of Catholics across the country remains critical as the Council's Listening and Discernment stage ramps up. The Council recently published the "Let's Listen and Discern" guide, a tool to help people participate in the practice of communal discernment. A number of resources, including videos, have also been released to offer advice on how discernment has evolved in the Catholic tradition.

"After almost a year of inviting people to share their experiences – both past and present – of the Church and of their own personal faith,

it is important that we now shift gears and fix our eyes on the Church's future through the National Themes for Discernment," Archbishop Costelloe said. "The voices we captured through Listening and Dialogue represent the largest collaborative process the Church has ever undertaken in Australia and it forms a central plank of our ongoing reflection. "But the process of discernment requires those voices to be considered in the light of Sacred Scripture, the living tradition of the Catholic Church, magisterial teachings and our evolving understanding of matters like leadership and governance – often gained from our ministries and the broader community."

The six National Themes for Discernment invite people to reflect, to pray and to consider how God is calling the People of God to be a Christ-centred Church in Australia that is: Missionary and Evangelising; Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal; Prayerful and Eucharistic; Humble, Healing and Merciful; A Joyful, Hope-Filled and Servant Community; Open to conversion, Renewal and Reform. Groups are encouraged to meet to consider one of the six National Themes for Discernment.

An online portal was recently opened to allow people around the country to share their discerned communal response of up to 1000 characters (about 150 words), offering practical ways to respond to the chosen National Theme for Discernment. Those responses will be provided to the Discernment and Writing Groups that will draw together the wisdom of the Church and the broader community to draft papers for consideration in the lead-up to the first session of the Plenary Council.

Plenary Council facilitator Lana Turvey-Collins said the Discernment and Writing Groups, which will hold their first meetings in the coming weeks, are being formed from another first-of-its-kind process.

"More than 400 people – from all parts of the country, from various cultural and linguistic backgrounds, from teenagers to people in their nineties – expressed their interest in helping the Church discern what God is calling us towards at this time in our history," she said.

"From that number, about 60 lay people, priests and religious will join 12 bishops to form the six Discernment and Writing Groups – skilled and faith-filled people who will prayerfully discern what the Spirit is saying to the Church in Australia." Archbishop Costelloe said the bishops on those groups "very much look forward to being part of this Church-wide process of discerning the will of God and responding to His will".
