The disciples said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith!'

Today's readings demonstrate our need for the gift of faith and the patience of faithfulness, to give us a new vision and understanding of the world.

In the *First Reading* the prophet Habakkuk looks at the evil all around him and the suffering of innocent people. He asks God, 'What's the point of praying?' when God does not appear to hear. The Lord offers no direct answer, but simply reassures him that the just person lives by faith in God – the One who sees the whole picture.

The *Psalms* urges us: 'O that *today* you would listen to his voice!' For us, 'today' means our own lives, as they are lived in the present moment.

Despite his imprisonment, Paul is confident in the Lord and dares to speak without fear. He reminds Timothy that faith is never possessed definitively but must be continually awakened. He also needs the power of God: the gifts of the Holy Spirit must be the driving force in his life (*Second Reading*).

The disciples are keen to learn and to grow and ask Jesus to increase their faith (*Gospel*). However, it is very clear that the way of the disciple is hard. It involves dying to ourselves and our self-promoting needs. Jesus's parable reminds them that faith is ultimately a gift from God which grows throughout our lives 'fanned into a flame', as in the second reading.

We can trace the history of our own faith and remember personal moments that strengthened the faith. These can be varied – prayer, love, works of justice, the beauty of creation, times of illness and death, sacramental life. What is important is that they are personal moments between us and God, which are privileged times of the growth of the mustard seed of faith.

Faith grows in surprising ways. God is at work all the time spreading and supporting our faith just like the mustard seed in varied and loving ways. *Pathways to God / Donal Neary sj 2019*

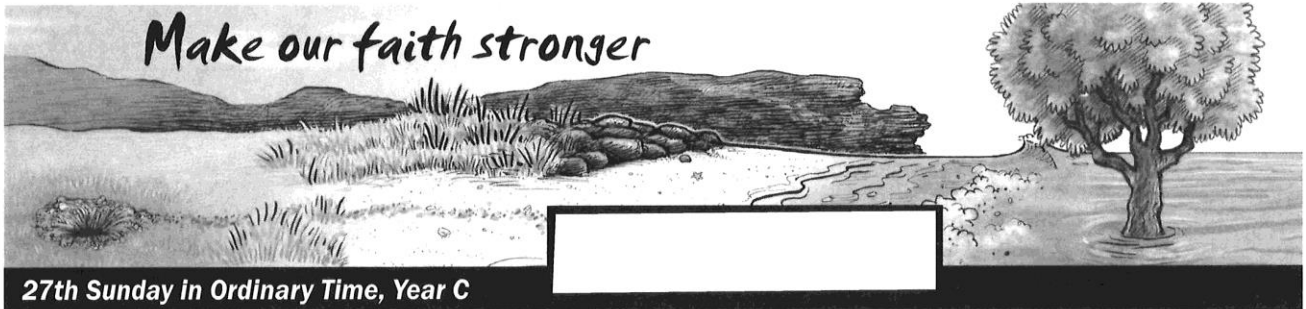

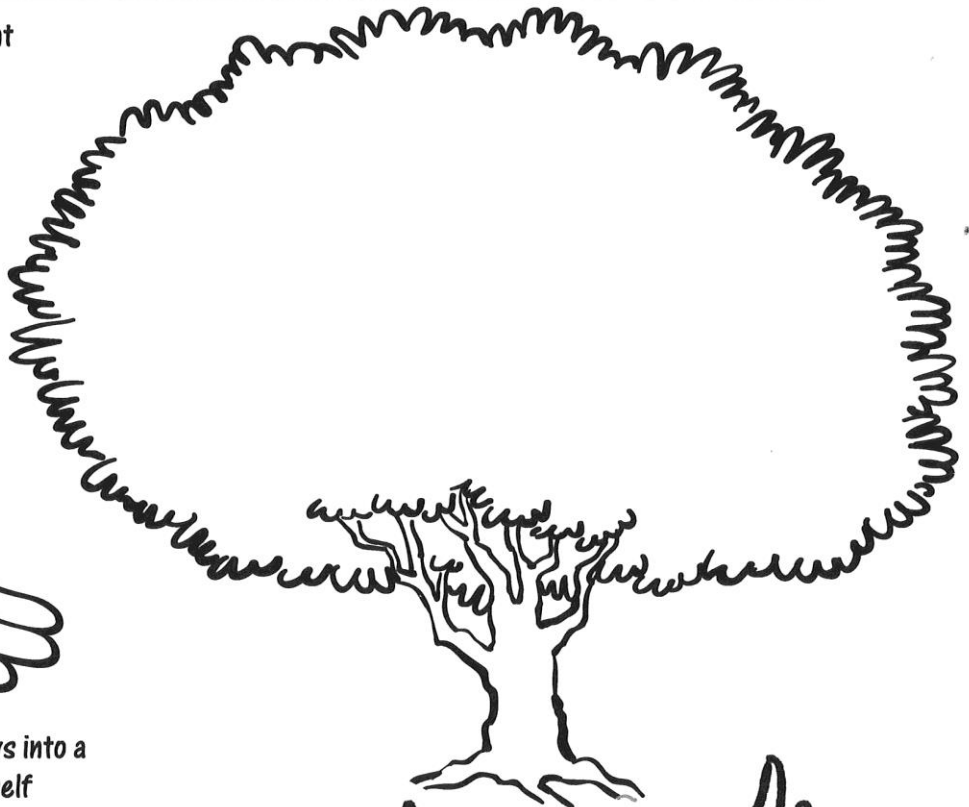

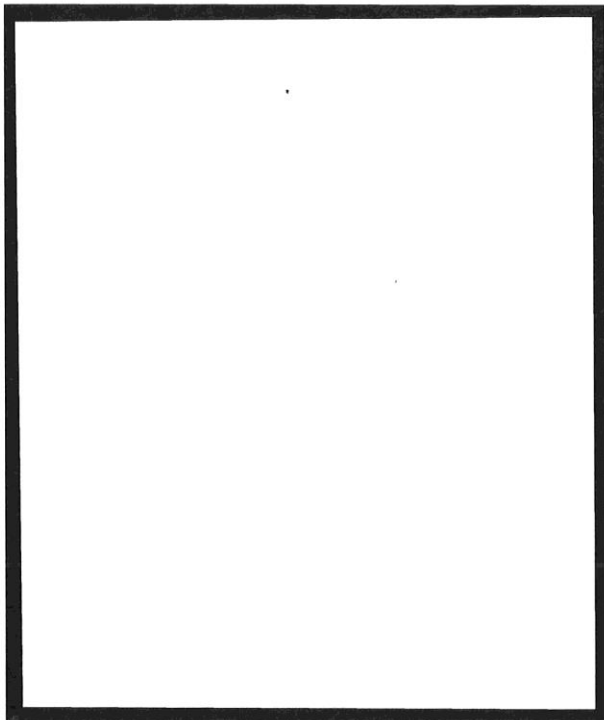

A reading from the prophet Habakkuk

The just will live by faithfulness.

How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny?
