Manly Sat 10am – 11am Freshwater Sat 4:30pm The person in today's Gospel appears to have the right attitude but look closely at his question. 'What must *I* do to inherit eternal life?' He sounds like a typical commodity broker in today's society. His attitude is: if I want to achieve something then I just have to do certain things; wear the right clothes, have the right car, go to the right university, live in the right neighbourhood. He mixes this attitude with the sense of having a *right* to eternal life as if it is his due inheritance.

Unfortunately, God's reign, or as this Gospel terms it, eternal life, is not a commodity in a market economy. Eternal life is a freely given gift of God. It does not depend on what is possible for us to do, as if we can therefore earn it, or have a right to it, but on the loving possibility of what God can do for us.

We stand before God's gratuitous love as empty-handed recipients. We neither earn nor deserve such love and this is a discomforting awareness. Jesus' response to the man offers him the opportunity to know this attitude of his own neediness and emptiness before God.

The Kingdom that Jesus offers is a wealth that makes all other things pale into insignificance. Down through history, many have valued this even more than life itself.

In the Gospel passage today, Jesus read the deep desires of the young man. The Gospel says, 'Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him.' Knowing his deeper self, Jesus then offered him a way of achieving these desires — but it involved a choice that this man was not able to make. Each of us is called to live more deeply in a relationship with Jesus who looks on us, loves us and calls us to write the law of love on our hearts in such a way that there will be justice for all people.

STONEWORK CONSERVATION PROJECT commenced this week

Our planned stonework

conservation works necessary to protect our beautiful Church here at St. Mary Immaculate continues.

The main area affected will be the Altar end of the Church outside walls (facing the sea) and this will result in the access around that end of the outside church being "closed off " so that this vital restoration work can be undertaken in the safest manner to school children, teachers and parishioners. An area adjacent to the Church will have bollards and tape in place to ensure safe movement of Students and Parishioners.

This area will become a fully supervised "construction site" for the 2 months restoration period. This small inconvenience will be worth the effort to strengthen and preserve our Church building from the constant salt air and weather, that hits that end of the building, from the seaside.



On Sunday 14 Oct 2018, Pope Francis will preside over the canonizations of Pope Paul VI (Pope from 21 June 1963 to his death in 1978) and Msgr. Oscar Romero.

Pope Francis will canonize Pope Paul VI who faced both new and old challenges: He continued Vatican II after Pope John XXIII died, he helped clarify the relationship of authority between the pontiff and the bishops, highlighted the role of the laity and was the first pontiff to travel outside Italy.

The other canonization is that of Msgr Oscar Romero. Archbishop of San Salvador; Romero spoke out against poverty, social injustice, assassinations, and torture. In 1980, Romero was assassinated while offering Mass.

SPECIAL PRAYER CAMPAIGN FOR THE CHURCH OCTOBER 2018

During this month of October, the Holy Father asks us and all the faithful for a greater effort in our personal and community prayer. He invites us to pray every day the Holy Rosary with the intention that the Virgin Mary help the Church in these times of crisis, and to pray each day to St. Michael the Archangel that he defend us against the attacks of the Devil. According to spiritual tradition, Michael is the chief of the celestial armies and the protector of the Church (Revelation 12:7-9).

Pope Francis invites us at the conclusion of the Rosary with that most ancient invocation to the Holy Mother of God, "Sub Tuum Praesidium" as well as the traditional prayer to St. Micheal ascribed to Pope Leo the XIII



A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 10:17-30

Go and sell whatever you have and come follow me.

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land - not without persecutions - now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'


