**Gospel Reflection** In the Gospel reading a few weeks ago (just a chapter ago in Mark's Gospel), Jesus admonished his disciples for their pointless argument among themselves as to who was the most important. James and John apparently did not get the message.

In today's Gospel account, the two sons of Zebedee – who, with Peter, make up Jesus' inner circle – ask for the places of honor and influence when Jesus begins his reign. James and John proclaim their willingness to "drink the cup" of suffering and share in the "bath" or "baptism" of pain Jesus will experience (the Greek word used is **baptizein**, meaning to immerse oneself in an event or situation). Jesus finally tells them that the assigning of such honors is the prerogative of God the Father.

Most readers share the other disciples' indignation at the incredible nerve of James and John to make such a request (Matthew, in his Gospel, casts the two brothers in a better light by having their mother make the request -- Matthew 20: 20.) Jesus calls the disciples together to try again to make them understand that he calls them to greatness through service. Jesus' admonition to them is almost a pleading: *If you really understand me and what I am about, if you really want to be my disciple, if you really seek to be worthy of my name, then you must see the world differently and respond to its challenges with a very different set of values. The world may try to justify vengeance rather than forgiveness, to glorify self-preservation over selflessness, to insist on preserving the system and convention for the sake of compassion and justice – but it cannot be that way with you.*



**GOSPEL REFLECTION** Anyone who reads the gospel of Mark thoughtfully will be struck by the paradox it presents. On the one hand we encounter Jesus as a figure of immense power: he rebukes demons, calms the sea, and teaches with astonishing authority. On the other he steadfastly renounces the use of power. He calls himself a servant and insists that his disciples make themselves slaves to all.

We see in Jesus that being a servant does not mean being weak and ineffectual. That is something Jesus never was. He impressed people time and again with his authority, because he never sought power over others. Being so free, so centred, and so attuned to the power of love, he could put all his capacities at the service of others' well-being.

The Catholic theologian Gustavo Guttieres put it this way: "Serving does not mean that we passively accept that things continue as they are. Serving implies initiative and creativity, knowledge and efforts, to build a human, just and loving world" (Sharing the Word through the Liturgical Year). *Liturgy Brisbane 2021*

# WELCOME TO THE 29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In the Gospels, we often hear stories that show a total disconnect between what Jesus is trying to show the disciples, and their understanding of it. Today's Gospel is one such instance. Jesus has just spoken of his upcoming death, and yet the disciples are squabbling about who will take the places of honour in the Kingdom of Heaven. This passage encourages us to look squarely at the reality of the Kingdom of God that Jesus inaugurated, one where love and self-giving rule, rather than privilege and love of self.

And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking.'

"They want to be winners and not losers, finally. They have been losing their whole life and now this man is going to make them winners. And Jesus listens to them squabbling. These are the men that he's going to found the Kingdom of God? These are the men that want the authority of the world. ...

And what is the authority of God? The authority of God is not in domination. It is not in winning. The authority of God is in loving."

#### FEAST:

**Feast St Luke the Evangelist (October 18)** St Luke, the writer of the Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, has been identified with St. Paul's "Luke, the beloved physician" (Colossians 4:14). It is only in his Gospel that we hear of the Annunciation and the Archangel Gabriel's visit to Zechariah, the parable of the Good Samaritan, and stories such as the one grateful Samaritan leper (Lk.17:11-19). Tradition holds that St Luke received much of his information in his Gospel writings from Mary.






The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for all.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'
