The qualities required for faithful prayer and the inner disposition that we need to pray run throughout our readings this Sunday.

The First Reading gives us the image of Moses, arms upheld by Aaron and Hur, as he prays all day that Israel might win the battle against Amalek. This perseverance in prayer, in the form of faithfulness to the scriptures, is part of Paul's encouragement to Timothy in the Second Reading. It leads us to find wisdom and salvation in Christ Jesus. The pilgrim in Psalm 120 (121) puts all his trust in God. God is faithful; he is our guardian and he never sleeps.

This trust and confidence is needed when our God seems to be silent, as shown in the Gospel. Jesus's parable of the widow and the unjust judge is an encouragement to be unwearied in prayer.

The core story is a parable of prayer and perseverance. The poorest of the poor, a widow (the very symbol of powerlessness in an rural patriarchal society) is shown as the contrast to the disciple who can stand before the righteous God. If you can accept that a widow can succeed before an unjust human power, then how can you doubt that God, who is goodness and righteousness, will not hear your prayers?

Jesus is our model of prayer. His focus is on the attitude of the one praying rather than on God. For Jesus, it goes without saying that he trusts deeply that God hears our prayer. Jesus' concern is that we might not believe this and so give up. Therefore, in Luke we see people praising and thanking God, and turning to him in their need. His focus is on the attitude of the one praying rather than on God. For Jesus, it goes without saying that he trusts deeply that God hears our prayer. Jesus' concern is that we might not believe this and so give up.

Therefore, in Luke we see people praising and thanking God and turning to God in their need. The message is simple: keep on praying and remember that prayer's purpose is not to change God but to change us in how we listen to God in our life.

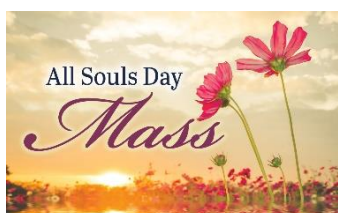

In October 2020, the Catholic Church in Australia will gather for the first Plenary Council to be held since the second Vatican Council. In 2018, the entire People of God in Australia began preparing for this historic moment by listening to God, by listening to one another's stories of faith.

More than 222,000 people participated in listening and dialogue encounters and contributed 17,457 submissions during the first stage of preparation for the Australian Plenary Council. The voices of the faithful help all of us to understand something of the historical experience and the current reality of the Catholic Church in Australia. This gathered data also reveals some deeper hopes and questions, and the diverse yearnings, that we are now challenged to consider together.

The National Themes for Discernment named below are inspired by the data and call us toward the future.

- *Humble, Healing and Merciful*
- *Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal.*
- *A Joyful, Hope-filled & Servant Community*
- *Prayerful and Eucharistic*

First Reading *Exodus 17:8-13 (JB)*

A reading from the book of Exodus

As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage.

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses' arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm until sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

child, you have known the holy scriptures - from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience - but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death."

And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'
