Manly Sat 10am – 11am Freshwater Sat 4:30pm The Gospel shows two disciples approaching Jesus for their own personal gain rather than for loving service. Jesus highlights the true way, and the path he will walk as high priest. The Apostles, as we heard in today's Gospel, hadn't studied the prophecies of Isaiah's suffering servant closely enough.

Their idea of the Messiah was a powerful political and military leader who would make Israel back into a player on the international scene. And so, James and John, looking forward to that day, try to reserve their spots in the King's court. Jesus has to remind them that his Kingdom is about sacrifice and service, not power politics and self-indulgence.

Jesus brought service even further – to serve like him was to serve God his Father, because that was what his mission on earth would be. The service people give is the service of God. In that mission Jesus would be misunderstood, and eventually put to death. The request of the apostles brings to light our natural desires to be approved of and rewarded in worldly terms.

Jesus tells us his meaning of real greatness – service and the care of others. Realising that Jesus is our servant is what helps us to be servants to others. Even in his Resurrection we see him assisting the apostles – reaching out to them to share his joy and consolation. He walked with them in their confusion doubts, fears and disappointments. He continues to show them what real love means in his risen life.

Pope Francis embodies the spirit of today's Gospel: He stated: 'I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. Heal the wounds,' And in his actions he has shown himself as a true 'Servant of the servants of God' as Jesus commands in today's Gospel.

We are a servant church –the community of Jesus' followers are at the service of people, to make better conditions of life, to live and share with compassion in the hardships of others, to care for the earth and protect it. May we be servants to one another helping God's kingdom come.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 10:35-45


The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for all.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'


