This Sunday we celebrate Jesus Christ's life of service and ministry.

In the so-called 'Servant Song', Isaiah writes of the mysterious servant of the Lord God. Christians have long identified him with Jesus, who was formed by God in the womb and sent into the world as 'the light of the nations'. (**First Reading**)

The words of the Psalmist would fit well on the lips of the Servant. He worships God with 'an open ear', and with a spirit that delights in generous service.

In the **Gospel**, we encounter not only Jesus as he begins his public ministry, but also John the Baptist, who witnesses to Jesus's baptism. John hears the voice of the Father and sees the Spirit descend and rest on Jesus: a revelation of the three persons of the Trinity.

In the **Second Reading**, Paul wishes the Corinthians the grace and peace of Christ; a grace that implies everything associated with God's free gifts to us in Christ.

We, too, like the Corinthians, have a calling to be holy and to lead a life of prayer. This week, we might pray for the grace of an 'open ear' and an open heart and ask for continued faithfulness in our Christian ministry this coming year. *Pathways to God 2020*

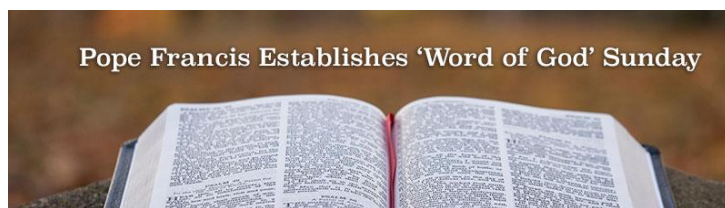
We have a wonderful PPC here at Manly Freshwater who works closely with our Priests and the parish community. As we commence a new year we would like to invite you to consider coming on board.

St Mary's Youth Pilgrimage to Perth for the Australian Catholic Youth Festival (ACYF)

"Listen to what the spirit is saying". In the midst of Australia's increasing secularisation, it seemed fitting that this call should be the theme for this year's Australian Catholic Youth Festival (ACYF), the biennial national youth celebration of the Catholic faith. 7 pilgrims from St Mary's embarked on a 6 day pilgrimage to Perth for this year's ACYF, joining 5500 other pilgrims from all across the nation.



Day 1 and our first activity in Perth was Saturday Vigil Mass, Eucharistic Adoration and a Praise & Worship session co-led by our very own Fr Paul, Simon Hyland and Josh Willard.

ACYF itself began on Day 2, the opening plenary starring former X factor contestant Fr Rob Galea and American rapper Joe Melendrez, followed by various workshops including Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Reconciliation, concerts, speeches and discussions, whilst the evening plenary also featured Taize prayers co-led by St Mary's musicians Simon, Josh and Alex Gale.

Day 3 began with Simon leading the pre-plenary entertainment, peaking with Fr Paul engaging in a dance-off in front of a crowd of close to 6,000 (link below), followed by a guest speaker discussing modern slavery, before pilgrims and team leaders mutually took turns to stand and bless the other group through music: the lyrics of Matt Maher's *"Lord, I need you"*, echoing around the walls of the jam-packed hall.

The evening plenary was highlighted by Eucharistic Adoration, yet for all the sanctity of collective prayer through hymn, rising to Heaven like incense from a thurifer, nothing could be more beautiful than the subsequent still sound of silence, the emptiness of our ears contrasted by the openness of our hearts, creating an unrivalled atmosphere of Holy worship, even stronger than that of the recent Praisefest (Broken Bay's termly Youth Festival).



But the ensuing small group discussion with St Paul's students reminded us of the "reality" of the Catholic



Church today: an ever-shrinking youth population, a public image destroyed by the horrible, pedophilic acts of certain clergy, the discussion serving as a reminder of Archbishop of Perth Timothy Costelloe's opening speech: *"Go out and rebuild [God's] Church. Help it to set out on new... pathways. Help stop the Church... from falling into ruin"*.



Day 4 of our pilgrimage, the final day of ACYF, saw the 300 Broken Bay pilgrims venerate the Cross prior to a pilgrimage walk to our final venue, hosting a two-hour long pre-Mass concert (link below), our final Mass and a concluding post-Mass concert all filled with amazing worship music, a fitting end to a faith-filled 3 days of ACYF.

The final day and a half of our pilgrimage in Perth encompassed visits to St Mary's Cathedral (Perth), Fremantle beach, before finishing on a Christmas lights tour in Perth CBD.

Overall, ACYF was incredibly inspiring, strong call for its youth to grow ever closer to God in our ever-secularising world, and not to solely await the next Australian Catholic Youth Festival, but rather, strive for the day in which every day is an Australian Catholic Youth Festival.

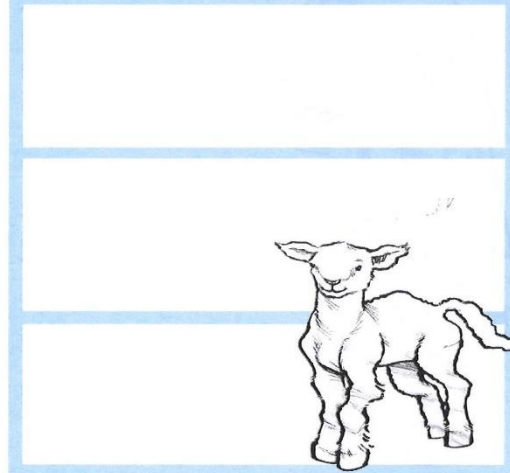
Here is the Lamb of God
