Gospel Reflection

The Fourth Gospel emphasizes John the Baptiser's role as the bridge between the First and New Testaments: he is the last great prophet who identifies Jesus as the Messiah. In his vision of the Spirit of God "resting" upon and within Jesus, the Baptizer realizes that this is the chosen Servant of God who

has come to inaugurate the Messianic era of forgiveness and reconciliation (today's first reading, the second of Isaiah's "servant" songs, describes the mission of the servant: to bring Israel back to the Lord and, through her, extend the Lord's salvation to every nation and people on earth). connectionsmediaworks.com

John 1:29-34 (JB)


A reading from the holy Gospel according to John
