
#### Prayer in time of Bush Fire and Drought



# 150th Anniversary of the opening of Mary Immaculate Church Manly, 8th December 1869

On 8th December 2019 our parish begins the celebrations of the 150th Anniversary of the opening of the first weatherboard Church in what was then Manly Beach Parish, dedicated to Mary Immaculate. We will continue our Anniversary celebrations throughout 2020. We welcome your celebration suggestions and your participation. *Kindest regards Fr David Taylor PP* 

#### Catholic Church at Manly Beach - A Short Historical Review from the Newspapers

With the daily increasing population of Manly Beach, the want of a Catholic Church has long been felt, and the Rev. Dr. Powell of St. Leonard's, under whose pastoral care the Catholics of Manly are placed is about to commence to collect funds to do away with this inconvenience. Collections' for a new church at Manly will commence on Monday next, and on the following Sunday mass will be said in a temporary church. Many Catholics would be glad to go on Saturday afternoon, and spend the day if they could hear mass there, and we trust that Dr. Powell's efforts will be successful. *Freemans Journal 29 April 1865* 

**Catholic Church Manly Beach**. - Tomorrow the Rev. Dr. Powell will celebrate two masses in the temporary chapel, the first at 8 a. m., and the second at ten o'clock. Confessionals will be attended on this evening and to-morrow morning. We believe it is the intention of the Rev. Dr. Powell to urge upon his congregation the absolute necessity at once of commencing to build a church in this favourite spot. The Catholics are getting numerous there and would become more so if they could hear mass every Sunday. On to-morrow the steamer leaves at half -past ten, and mass will not commence till it reaches Manly. *Freemans Journal Saturday May 5 1866 pg 282* 

It is contemplated to erect a Roman Catholic Church at Manly Beach. A beautiful site facing the Pacific Ocean has been liberally given by Mr G Smith. *Empire 15 May 1865 pg 8* 

**Catholic Church Manly Beach**. — This favourite watering place for the citizens of Sydney, is becoming to be extensively patronised during the hot summer months, and the want of a Catholic Church is very much felt. The place is visited periodically by Father Powell of St. Leonards and on Sunday last he celebrated Mass in the large saloon, of the Steyne Hotel. There was a fair attendance and the services consisted of a Missa Cantata, during which several motettes were, sung; accompanied by a piano. We understand that Dr. Powell intends to try and build a church, and through the generosity of Mr Gilbert Smith, he has obtained a plot of grounds in the very centre of the township. We hope he will succeed for the presence of - a Catholic Church would be a strong inducement- for Catholics to reside in Manly Beach. *Freemans Journal Sat 19 Jan 1867 pg 9* 

Fr Callahan McCarthy on 24 Feb 1867 tendered via St Mary's Cathedral to build a Catholic Church for Manly Beach Parish. Construction commenced in 1868. The builders were John Wilson and William Bagnell. The cost of construction was One thousand two hundred and thirty-one pounds. The church was 40 feet long,18 feet high and 10 feet high walls.

On 8 Dec 1869, the Feast of Mary Immaculate, the new wooden Church was blessed and opened in a Solemn Mass.

#### LITURGY OF THE WORD REFLECTION



As we take another step into Advent, the **First Reading** introduces one of the main themes of this period of the year: Peace. Isaiah paints a picture of the whole world, of people and animals living together in harmony, led by a King who has all the qualities to rule justly.

The **Psalm**, too, speaks of this hope for peace and justice for all. St Paul, when he writes to the Romans, also mentions the hope which can be found in Scripture. All the more reason, then, for us to be tolerant of one another, so we can all give glory to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. **(Second Reading)** 

In this week's **Gospel**, John the Baptist appears by the River Jordan to entreat people to repent and prepare a way for the one who is to come. He tells them that being a son or daughter of Abraham will not be enough to be sure of being saved. There is no room for complacency. They are called to repent; to change their way of life.

Mindful of this week's readings, I can perhaps look around me and, whether by word or deed, encourage others to join me as I set out in haste to meet Jesus this Christmas. *Pathways to God 2019*

#### Second Sunday of Advent - Year A

First Reading

Isaiah 11:1-10 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

He judges the poor with justice.

A shoot springs from the stock of Jesse, a scion thrusts from his roots: on him the spirit of the Lord rests, a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. (The fear of the Lord is his breath.) He does not judge by appearances, he gives no verdict on hearsay, but judges the wretched with integrity, and with equity gives a verdict for the poor of the land. His word is a rod that strikes the ruthless; his sentences bring death to the wicked. Integrity is the loincloth round his waist, faithfulness the belt about his hips. The wolf lives with the lamb, the panther lies down with the kid, calf and lion cub feed together with a little boy to lead them. The cow and the bear make friends, their young lie down together. The lion eats straw like the ox. The infant plays over the cobra's hole; into the viper's lair the young child puts his hand. They do no hurt, no harm, on all my holy mountain, for the country is filled with the knowledge of the Lord as the waters swell the sea. That day, the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples. It will be sought out by the nations and its home will be glorious.

**Responsorial Psalm** *Ps 71:1-2, 7-8, 12-13, 17 (JB)* 

R. Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever.

O God, give your judgement to the king, to a king's son your justice, that he may judge your people in justice and your poor in right judgement. R.

In his days justice shall flourish and peace till the moon fails: He shall rule from sea to sea, from the Great River to earth's bounds. R.

For he shall save the poor when they cry and the needy who are helpless. He will have pity on the weak and save the lives of the poor. R.

May his name be blessed for ever and endure like the sun. Every tribe shall be blessed in him, all nations bless his name. R.

#### Second Reading

Romans 15:4-9 (JB)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans Christ, the hope of all people.

Everything that was written long ago in the scriptures was meant to teach us something about hope from the examples scripture gives of how people who did not give up were helped by God. And may he who helps us when we refuse to give up, help you all to be tolerant with each other, following the example of Christ Jesus, so that united in mind and voice you may give glory to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

It can only be to God's glory, then, for you to treat each other in the same friendly way as Christ treated you. The reason Christ became the servant of circumcised Jews was not only so that God could faithfully carry out the promises made to the patriarchs, it was also to get the pagans to give glory to God for his mercy, as scripture says in one place: For this I shall praise you among the pagans and sing your name.

Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.

In due course John the Baptist appeared; he preached in the wilderness of Judaea and this was his message: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' This was the man the prophet spoke of when he said:

A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.

This man John wore a garment made of camel-hair with a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. I baptise you in water for repentance, but the one who follows me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand; he will clear his threshing-floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.'


