We are on the doorstep of the Lenten season a time of self-examination; where we are asked to make time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These three pillars of Lent help us refocus on the relationship we have with Jesus as we journey toward Easter; as we deepen our commitment to Jesus, which we were originally committed to at our Baptism. Lent and Easter are intricately linked to our baptism; it is the one time in the Church calendar that is devoted to renewing our baptismal vows. Throughout the 40 days of Lent we put into action the sacred pillars, in preparation of the resurrection of our baptismal vows at Easter.

**Prayer** directs us to Jesus and making time in the day to pray and read scripture is important. Our Lenten resource *Discerning the Way of Jesus* (see below) uses the *lectio divina* method of engaging with scripture and hearing what the Lord is saying to *you*. Making him a part of your whole day is imperative. We do this by acknowledging and praising his goodness in things we encounter throughout the day; asking for assistance in situations; and asking for forgiveness when we do not act in a way that is a witness to Him (Thess 5:16-18). Living out our day in a way that is a testament to Christ is a powerful prayer which can transform not only ourselves but those around us whom we encounter.

In the Old Testament and during Jesus' time it was known that prayer was accompanied by **fasting**; one is connected to the other. Fasting is said to be the 'prayer of the body' which when paired with actual prayer makes it all-powerful. Abstaining gives us the ability to empty ourselves and shed all things which are crowding us; allowing us to make a space for God and fill it with all that is good bringing us closer to Him. The well-known practice of abstaining from meat is accompanied by other modern suggestions of fasting, of which some ideas can found below.

Almsgiving is both prayer and fasting combined; we are told that "Those who give alms will enjoy a full life" (Tobit 12:9). Almsgiving is prayer as it is giving in the name of God; and fasting because it is self-sacrifice for another. The giving by a person is transformative for the person giving as well as the one receiving. Almsgiving is most likely the most neglected pillar though Jesus clearly states it as necessary; regarding almsgiving he does not say 'if' 'when' (Matt 6:2-3). Caritas' Compassion Appeal runs through Lent and raises much needed funds for communities around the world (see below)

This Lenten season let us prepare well to fully recommit ourselves to God using the tools given to us; transform our lives through the relationship we grow in with God and transform those around us as they witness our promises lived out!



#### Personal Reflection for the week from our Discerning the Way of Jesus – Lenten Program

Can I identify times that I am focusing on external things rather than making time for Jesus?

How can I be more aware of moments that I can give to Jesus to develop a closer and more trusting relationship with him and allow myself to be simply loved by Him?

#### **Front Page Reflection**

Today the readings will reveal to us the covenant relationship the exists between us and our God. We will be reminded how God will guide us through this journey of covenant relationship. The Transfiguration describes, in a dramatic way, how loved Jesus was by God and how this experience was seen and known by his disciples.

We hear people say they have not, or cannot, experience the presence of God, and therefore deny that God exists. These readings show us that if you want to encounter God then you have to experience love. This is not an optional extra for the Christian life.

Something big always happens when Jesus goes to a mountain – beatitudes, this scene, the ascension. Traditionally it is a mountain where humans encounter God's Glory. So, this is a very important scene. For him and for his disciples.

Jesus wanted to show his disciples who he is and his mission in the world. Jesus knew he was loved by his Father, this love made him radiant. He knew the voice of God was right, claiming him as his son. This was for them, that they would listen to him. The first moment of the Christian disciple's life is to listen to God in prayer, His Word (scripture) and through the Sacraments and the world in which we live.

Pope Francis said that "we are called to carry the fruits of the experience we have with God to our troubled brothers and sisters, sharing with them the treasures of grace received. To those who are sick, bereaved, worried, homeless and in trouble". Jesus was revealing to the disciples, God's plan in the transfiguration—the passion and death of Jesus was to come, making the transfiguration a foretaste of the resurrection. 
