

Mary Immaculate, Manly and St John the Baptist, Freshwater

Second Sunday of Lent - 8th March 2020



On the second Sunday of Lent, we read and pray with the Transfiguration of Jesus: the event that Matthew, Mark and Luke tell us took place up a high mountain. It is an episode that gives us a glimpse of both Jesus's humanity and his divinity. Here Jesus is also able to reassure his friends – and us – that there is no need to be afraid, even as we witness such extraordinary events. (Gospel)

We hear of the Lord speaking to Abram, telling him to leave everything he knows with the promise of great blessings. (**First Reading**)

The **Psalm** reflects on the faithfulness of God's word. He will be our help and shield if, like Abram, we place our hope in him.

Both Abram's call and the disciples' witnessing of the Transfiguration do not occur as a reward, but by 'God's own purpose and grace' (**Second Reading**). Paul encourages Timothy to accept the hardships he encounters and rely on the power of God, strengthened by the grace of the appearing of Jesus Christ.

This week, then, as we continue on our Lenten journey, we focus our prayer on all those who are afraid, asking that they place their hope in the Lord and experience his comforting love. Pathways to God 2020




The Parish Playgroup is held during school terms on Monday morning in the Parish Hall at Manly from 8.30am to 10.30am.



CORONAVIRUS UPDATE...

Since the emergence of the Coronavirus, COVID-19, Bishop Anthony has offered instruction for our Diocese on preventative measures appropriate to any situation of concern about public health. These are continually being reviewed.

- · Health authorities continue to advise that the best precaution is frequent handwashing.
- Holy Water will be temporarily removed from stoups at the doors of the Churches to reduce the possibility of transmission of the virus. Holy Water will be available for people to take home.
- At the Sign of Peace (before Communion), individuals should avoid shaking hands but say "Pease be with you".
- · All Eucharistic Ministers are asked to use the hand sanitisers on the Sanctuary before and after distributing Communion.
- Across our diocese and many Australian dioceses, we are taking the precaution of not sharing the Communion chalice until further notice. You are reminded that Jesus Christ is fully present under either species of bread or wine.
- The option of receiving Communion on the tongue is still available until the situation is further reviewed. If however you are unwell in any manner, for health reasons please do not receive communion on the tonque.
- In light of these health issues, those who are unable to attend Sunday Mass can honour their Sunday obligation by having a time of prayer at home, reading the Scriptures, or watching Mass on TV or online.





A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him'. When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'


