



Dear Friends,

Great news. We are now able to have increased numbers at Mass, 150 at Manly with social distancing and still 74 at Freshwater because of the limited space. Families are able to sit together.



Our First Holy Communion program is progressing well and with the easing of restrictions we hope to be able to extend invitations to other family members.

We have received confirmation from NSW Government Health that we may go ahead with our Christmas Day lunch with some changes.

Bishop Anthony will join us for the Parish Feast Day of Mary Immaculate on Tuesday 8th December for Mass at Manly at 6pm.

Unfortunately, we still are unable to hold our usual morning tea's but it's wonderful to see so many of you coming back to Mass.

I also draw to your attention the issue of crowding in the Church foyer at Manly before and after the Sunday Masses. To help resolve this, we encourage you to use the "QR Code" with your smart phones where this is possible. After Holy Communion the side door of the Church facing the car park will be opened for exit only.

Please remember to maintain social distancing when going up to Communion and returning to your seat.

Weekday Mass at Freshwater will be held on Tuesdays at 9.15am. Masses at Manly will remain the same Tuesday to Friday 9.15am. Plenty of parking available.

REFLECTION

In today's readings, through the strength that Christ gives us and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, we celebrate with joy the great commandment of Love.

In the First Reading, we see some of the details of the Law of Moses that highlight the nature of God, his relationship with his people, and the way he wants us to live. Israel, as the chosen people, are to demonstrate kindness and concern for others, the same qualities that their compassionate God displays towards them.

With the Psalmist, we are invited to give expression to our love of God and to recognise that no single word can convey all that God means to us. He is our source of strength; without him we can do nothing.

This first letter of Paul to the Thessalonians is the earliest preserved Christian document. We hear of the joyful faith of this small Christian community - a fruit of the Holy Spirit. Their approach to faith is attracting attention, and acts as an inspiration to many. (Second Reading).

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that it is impossible to separate love of God, of self, and of other people. Jesus's own life is a demonstration of such all-consuming love in practice. He tells us that these three facets of love and of faith cannot be separated: they sum up the entire biblical story.

This week, I express gratitude to the Lord for the many gifts of his wondrous love in my life. I ask that I may have the sensitivity to love as God loves; forever finding new ways of expressing my love, especially in my dealings with the poor and the lonely. Pathways to God 2020.

Exodus 22:20-26 (JB)

A reading from the book of Exodus

If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan, my anger will rage against you.

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans.

"If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him.

"If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."

Second Reading 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10 (JB)

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

You turned away from idols to serve God and await his Son.

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and

of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.
