



Rejoice!' The word that begins the First Reading resounds in today's liturgy. Isaiah wants to show us that it is in the

wilderness – the place of loneliness and desolation, and every human need – where rejoicing is to be found. It is exactly here, in the wastelands (the home of John the Baptist), where God's promise is to be discovered.

And what is God's promise? That he will save us (First Reading, Psalm and Second Reading) and therefore we must not lose heart. Even though we may feel we are stuck in the wild places, God is at work here.

The **Gospel** shows salvation explained and opened out: the blind see, the lame walk, the deaf hear and lepers are healed. Christ's actions fulfil the words of the prophet Isaiah and, today, give us hope to face the difficulties of the world and of our day-to-day lives.

Pope Francis reflects: "There is no prayer in which Jesus does not inspire us to do something. Our faith in Jesus is seen in strong action". We might pray that Christmas will be happy for others because of us – happy in body, with enough food for every family, happy in mind that we know the truth of God's coming into the world, and happy in forgiveness, for that is one of God's biggest gifts.

On this Gaudete ('Rejoice') Sunday, let's give thanks for all that is good, and pray that we might also trust in the joyful hope of that which awaits us.

Love one another as I have loved you


- How well do I show my love for the members of my family as parent, spouse, son / daughter, brother / sister?

- Have there been times when I have shown arrogance and pride, or used my talents to be hurtful or make others uncomfortable?
- Do I respect my body as the temple of the Holy Spirit, have I respected the gift of sex, or have I given way to my vices and passions?
- Am I careful to discipline my mind in what I see and read, and what I watch on TV or other media?
- Have I been faithful to God's will for me regarding the commitment of marriage and faithful relationship of love? Have there been instances of unfaithfulness?
- How well have I dealt with the sorrows, losses, disappointments and difficulties of my life?

Isaiah 35:1-6, 10 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

God himself will come and save us.

Let the wilderness and the drv-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonguil, let it rejoice and sing for joy. The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God. Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. Matthew 11:2-11 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Are you the one who is to come, or must we wait for someone else?

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.'

As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you.
