The Papal conclave to elect the next pope will begin on May 7th in the Vatican's Sistine Chapel.

The cardinals will celebrate the Mass for the Election of the Roman Pontiff in St Peter's Basilica in the morning of Wednesday May 7th (Rome time) before processing into the Sistine Chapel late that afternoon-early evening.

There are 135 cardinals under the age of 80 who are eligible to vote in a papal election.

The youngest member of the conclave is 45-year old Ukrainian-born Cardinal Mykola Bychok of the Ukrainian Eparchy of Sts Peter and Paul of Melbourne.

Cardinals cast their votes for the election of the Pope through a secret ballot. By tradition and law this is held in the Sistine Chapel within the Vatican Apostolic Palace, which was closed to the public on Monday and remains completely sealed off until the election is completed.

Votes are taken once or twice in a morning session and once or twice in an afternoon session.

A two-thirds majority of the electors present is required to elect a Pope.

After the votes are counted, all ballots are burned. If the ballot was inconclusive, a chimney positioned over the Sistine Chapel and visible from St Peter's Square, emits black smoke. If a Pope is elected, white smoke is emitted.

Once the Cardinals have elected a new Pope, the Dean of the College, Cardinal Giovanni Battista Re, asks for the elected candidate's consent - "Do you accept your canonical election as Supreme Pontiff?".

Upon receiving consent, he then asks: "What name do you wish to be called?"

It is from this moment the newly-elected Pope, leader of the world's 1.4 billion Catholics, acquires full and supreme authority over the universal church.

Part 2 - Evidence of Jesus' Resurrection

Last week, we explored how the science of textual criticism—applied to the numerous ancient Biblical and non-Biblical manuscripts available today—allows scholars of antiquity to have high confidence in the accuracy, authenticity, and integrity of the New Testament Scriptures, as well as in the historical existence of Jesus Christ.



In the coming weeks, we will continue examining additional evidence for the Resurrection. Some of the key points we will consider include:

- The Empty Tomb, Paul's Dilemma, and the Rise of Christian Messianism
- The Idea of Resurrection in Ancient Pagan Religions
- · Numerous Encounters with the Risen Christ
- The Changing of the Sabbath Day
- The Shroud of Turin

The Empty Tomb, Paul's Dilemma, and the Rise of Christian Messianism

The first sign that Jesus had risen from the dead comes with the discovery of the empty tomb. When we assess the various theories about what happened to Jesus' body, we find that none of them adequately explain the facts. For example, the Gospel of Matthew tells us that the chief priests bribed the guards with a large sum of money to claim that the disciples stole the body while the guards were asleep (Mt 28:12–15).

Yet this account itself reveals two important points:

- i. the chief priests implicitly acknowledged that the body was missing and that they did not possess it, and
- ii. if the disciples had indeed stolen the body, then—as St. Paul asserts—"if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (1 Cor 15:14). In other words, why would the disciples willingly suffer torture, persecution, and martyrdom to proclaim something they knew to be a lie? Moreover, from a theological perspective, if they were lying about God's divine action in raising Jesus, they would be jeopardising their eternal salvation.

This second point is often referred to as Paul's Dilemma. It supports the credibility of those who claimed to witness the risen Christ, as their motivations appear to be sincere and grounded in conviction rather than deception. Unlike followers of other messianic figures of the time—who typically disbanded or disappeared after their leader's death—Jesus' disciples endured intense persecution and humiliation, even after their Messiah was executed. Their perseverance suggests they had experienced something transformative: the Resurrection.

Furthermore, the continued spread and remarkable growth of Christianity, even under centuries of persecution, is itself noteworthy. While other ideologies have also expanded, Christianity stands out because it was not propagated by force or coercion. Rather, it spread through the forces of love, reason, and the personal witness of believers—many of whom were willing to die for their faith.

First Reading

Acts 5:27-32, 40-41 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

We are witnesses of these words, and so is the Holy Spirit.

The high priest demanded an explanation of the apostles. 'We gave you a formal warning,' he said 'not to preach in this name, and what have you done? You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and seem determined to fix the guilt of this man's death on us.' In reply Peter and the apostles said, 'Obedience to God comes before obedience to men; it was the God of our ancestors who raised up Jesus, but it was you who had him executed by hanging on a tree. By his own right hand God has now raised him up to be leader and saviour, to give repentance and forgiveness of sins through him to Israel. We are witnesses to all this, we and the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.' They warned the apostles not to speak in the name of Jesus and released them. And so they left the presence of the Sanhedrin glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name.

Jesus showed himself again to his disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No,' he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord,' Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

After the meal Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?' He answered, 'Yes Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He replied 'Yes, Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Look after my sheep.' Then he said to him a third time, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was upset that he asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' and said, 'Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my sheep.

'I tell you most solemnly, when you were young you put on your own belt and walked where you liked; but when you grow old you will stretch out your hands, and somebody else will put a belt around you and take you where you would rather not go.'

In these words he indicated the kind of death by which Peter would give glory to God. After this he said, 'Follow me.' The Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.
