

Third Sunday of Lent - 23 March 2025

Cultivating a Fruitful Heart: Embracing Generosity as Disciples of Christ



In this Sunday's Gospel (Luke 13:1-9), Jesus shares the parable of the barren fig tree, illustrating God's patience and the call to repentance. The vineyard owner, finding no fruit on the tree for three years, orders it to be cut down. However, the gardener

pleads for one more year, promising to cultivate and fertilize it, hoping it will bear fruit. This story emphasizes that while God's grace allows time for transformation, it is not indefinite; we are urged to act and produce spiritual fruit in our lives.

Reflecting on this, we are reminded of the familiar story of four individuals: Everybody, Somebody, Anybody, and Nobody. A crucial task awaited completion, and while Everybody was certain Somebody would address it, in the end, Nobody did. This tale underscores the importance of personal responsibility in our faith journey.

One tangible way to respond to this call is through our parish's **Planned Giving Program**. By dedicating a portion of our blessings, we actively participate in the mission of our parish, ensuring it remains a vibrant community of faith and service. This act of giving is not merely a financial contribution but a reflection of our commitment to bear fruit in God's vineyard.



Gospel Reflection


The belief prevailed in Jesus' time that disasters and catastrophes were signs of God's anger

against sinful individuals or people – those massacred in the temple by Pilate's soldiers during what the Romans perceived as a "revolt" and the workers who were killed when the tower they were building collapsed must have been horrible sinners. Nonsense, Jesus says in today's Gospel. In this present age, neither good fortune nor calamity are indicators of one's favor or disfavor with God. In the age of come, God will judge the hearts of every soul, regardless of their situation in life.

The parable of the fig tree is a parable of crisis and compassion: the fig tree draws strength and sustenance from the soil but produces nothing in return. Its only value is as firewood. A similar fate awaits those who squander their lives in greedy, selfish pursuits. God is the ever-patient gardener who gives every "fig tree" all the time, care and attention it needs to harvest.

The parable of the fig tree has been called the "Gospel of the second chance." The vinedresser pleads for the tree, asking that it be given another year to bear fruit. We always live in the hope and mercy of God who keeps giving us "second chances" to rise from the ashes of sin to rebuild and reform our lives.

Third Sunday of Lent - Year C

First Reading

Exodus 3:1-8, 13-15

A reading from the book of Exodus

This is what you must say to the children of Israel: I Am has sent me to you.

Moses was looking after the flock of Jethro, his father-in-law, priest of Midian. He led his flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in the shape of a flame of fire, coming from the middle of a bush. Moses looked; there was the bush blazing but it was not being burnt up. 'I must go and look at this strange sight,' Moses said 'and see why the bush is not burnt.' Now the Lord saw him go forward to look, and God called to him from the middle of the bush. 'Moses, Moses!' he said. 'Here I am,' he answered. 'Come no nearer,' he said. 'Take off your shoes, for the place on which you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your father,' he said 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.' At this Moses covered his face, afraid to look at God.

And the Lord said, 'I have seen the miserable state of my people in Egypt. I have heard their appeal to be free of their slave-drivers. Yes, I am well aware of their sufferings. I mean to deliver them out of the hands of the Egyptians and bring them up out of that land to a land rich and broad, a land where milk and honey flow.'

Then Moses said to God, 'I am to go, then, to the sons of Israel and say to them, "The God of your fathers has sent me to you." But if they ask me what his name is, what am I to tell them?' And God said to Moses, 'I Am who I Am. This' he added 'is what you must say to the sons of Israel: "The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you." This is my name for all time; by this name I shall be invoked for all generations to come.'

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

All this that happened to the people of Moses in the desert was written for our benefit.

I want to remind you how our fathers were all guided by a cloud above them and how they all passed through the sea. They were all baptised into Moses in this cloud and in this sea; all ate the same spiritual food and all drank the same spiritual drink, since they all drank from the spiritual rock that followed them as they went, and that rock was Christ. In spite of this, most of them failed to please God and their corpses littered the desert.

These things all happened as warnings for us, not to have the wicked lusts for forbidden things that they had. You must never complain: some of them did, and they were killed by the Destroyer.

All this happened to them as a warning, and it was written down to be a lesson for us who are living at the end of the age. The man who thinks he is safe must be careful that he does not fall.

Luke 13:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Unless you repent you will all perish as they did.

Some people arrived and told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with that of their sacrifices. At this he said to them, 'Do you suppose these Galileans who suffered like that were greater sinners than any other Galileans? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen on whom the tower at Siloam fell and killed them? Do you suppose that they were more guilty than all the other people living in Jerusalem? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did.'

He told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard and he came looking for fruit on it but found none. He said to the man who looked after the vineyard, "Look here, for three years now I have been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and finding none. Cut it down: why should it be taking up the ground?" "Sir," the man replied "leave it one more year and give me time to dig round it and manure it: it may bear fruit next year; if not, then you can cut it down.""
