# MANLY FRESHWATER PARISH Mary Immaculate, Manly and St John the Baptist, Freshwater

## 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time – 3/02/2019



In the gospel this week we read that those who listened to the initial speech of Luke's Jesus, rejected it! We are invited to look at our own resistances to Luke's version of Christianity, and to his proposal about the way we live if we want to follow Jesus.

When Jesus returns to Nazareth, in Luke's account, it is to give a sermon before the real commencement of his ministry. He tells the local Jewish community that God is also interested in Gentiles, and in many ways shows a preference for them over Jews. The people are initially delighted by the 'gracious words', literally 'the words of grace', which he spoke. Quite suddenly, the atmosphere changes, as Jesus challenges the people's expectations. He knows that their approval is superficial. Prophets are generally rejected by their own.

Jesus illustrates this by referring to the two Old Testament prophets, Elijah and Elisha. Elijah encountered persecution in Israel and both prophets performed mighty works for those who were not Jews. Jesus stresses that the healing mercy of God is for all. The people of Nazareth react in annoyance, reject their own prophet and threaten physical violence.

Luke anticipates here the different reactions to the preaching of Jesus found in the rest of the gospel. Acceptance, rejection and violence will all be present. The future of Jesus' ministry is thereby different from what it might have been had Nazareth received him well.... At the end of this gospel scene, Jesus – in Luke – leaves Nazareth for good and has no further connection with the place. The people of Nazareth missed the point about Jesus, about his real identity.

This also happens in the church and in the family. We need to be able to live in love with different points of view and different ways of life. We don't give up what is essential to our church, but we are brought into rethinking and sometimes to change, sometimes to stay with what is an everlasting truth.

Jesus is challenging those in Nazareth to see everyone as important, and especially the poor. He would always do this. And they would kill him for it, because he always put love ahead of organised religion before people.

## Second Reading 1 Corinthians 12:31 - 13:13

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

There are three things that last: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love.

Be ambitious for the higher gifts. And I am going to show you a way that is better than any of them. If I have all the eloquence of men or of angels, but speak without love, I am simply a gong booming or a cymbal clashing. If I have the gift of prophecy, understanding all the mysteries there are, and knowing everything, and if I have faith in all its fullness, to move mountains, but without love, then I am nothing at all. If I give away all that I possess, piece by piece, and if I even let them take my body to burn it, but am without love, it will do me no good whatever. Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offence, and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes. Love does not come to an end. But if there are gifts of prophecy, the time will come when they must fail; or the gift of languages, it will not continue for ever; and knowledge - for this, too, the time will come when it must fail. For our knowledge is imperfect and our prophesying is imperfect; but once perfection comes, all imperfect things will disappear. When I was a child, I used to talk like a child, and think like a child, and argue like a child, but now I am a man, all childish ways are put behind me. Now we are seeing a dim reflection in a mirror; but then we shall be seeing face to face. The knowledge that I have now is imperfect; but then I shall know as fully as I am known. In short, there are three things that last: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love.

## Gospel Luke 4:21-30

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

*Jesus, like Elijah and Elisha, was not sent only to the Jews.* 

Jesus began to speak in the synagogue, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' And he won the approval of all, and they were astonished by the gracious words that came from his lips. They said, 'This is Joseph's son surely?' But he replied, 'No doubt you will quote me the saying, "Physician, heal yourself" and tell me, "We have heard all that happened in Capernaum, do the same here in your own countryside."' And he went on, 'I tell you solemnly, no prophet is ever accepted in his own country. 'There were many widows in Israel, I can assure you, in Elijah's day, when heaven remained shut for three years and six months and a great famine raged throughout the land, but Elijah was not sent to any one of these: he was sent to the widow at Zarephath, a Sidonian town. And in the prophet Elisha's time there were many lepers in Israel, but none of these was cured, except the Syrian, Naaman.' When they head this everyone in the synagogue was enraged. They sprang to their feet and hustled him out of the town; and they took him up to the brow of the hill their town was built on, intending to throw him down the cliff, but he slipped through the crowd and walked away.
