

### **Gospel Reflection**

For the poor Jews of Jesus' time, the scribes were the voices of authority, the final arbiters of the Law in which God had revealed himself. Their interpretation of the Law was considered absolute.

"Demons" are encountered several times in Mark's Gospel. Anything that the people of Jesus' time could not understand or explain, such as disease, mental illness or bizarre or criminal behavior, were considered the physical manifestations of the evil one – "demons" or "unclean spirits."

Both demons and scribes are silenced in today's Gospel. Jesus' casting out the unclean spirit from the man possessed silences the voices of the demons that plague humanity. In his compassionate outreach to the poor and sick, Jesus "silences" the scribes by redefining the community's understanding of whereas the "authority" of the scribes' words is based solely on their perceived status and learnedness, the authority of Jesus is born of compassion, peace and justice. The casting out of the demons and his curing of the sick who come to him are but manifestations of the power and grace of his words.

Note that the people of the Bible viewed miracles differently than we do. While we, in our high technology, scientific approach to the world, dismiss miracles as some kind of disruption or "overriding" of the laws of nature, the contemporaries of Jesus saw miracles as signs of God's immediate activity in his creation. While we ask, *How could this happen?* they asked. *Who is responsible?* Their answer was always the same: the God of all creation. Those who witnessed Jesus' healings, then, saw them as God directly touching their lives.

### What is a Catechist?

A Catechist is a person who gives her/his time voluntarily to provide religious education to children in primary and secondary state schools.

Catechists are those who are called to serve through teaching, witness, prayer, service and building community.

## Do you realise you have the qualities to be a Catechist?

A Catechist needs to be a person who:

- Is loving
- Cares for others
- Is fond of children
- Lives their faith
- Has common sense
- Enjoys a laugh
- Wants to contribute
- Can give 1 hour a week of their time

### A Catechist does not need to be:

- Religious experts
- Qualified teachers
- Able to drive

### Why be a Catechist?

- Jesus asked that we "...spread the Good News to the whole world"
- To be a Christian, is to want to share this 'Good News' of God's love with everyone.
- St Paul tells us that "Faith without good works is dead".

- There are around 500 Catholic children in our Parish, attending State Primary Schools, many of whom through no fault of their own, would otherwise receive little, if any teaching on the 'Good News' of God's love.
- To thank God in a tangible way for all He has given to you.
- It is a great way to use your God given talents to spread His word.
- New Catechists and assistants are urgently needed now to replace retirees.

### What is involved?

Lesson materials comprising of comprehensive teachers' manuals and student workbooks are provided. A set curriculum is followed.

The Diocese of Broken Bay provide to catechists and helpers training sessions and fun workshops through out the year to equip and give Catechists ideas with teaching in the classrooms. These training sessions can be completed on line or face to face free of charge.

### Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

First Reading Deuteronomy 18:15-20 (JB)

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

I will put my words into the prophet's mouth, and he will tell them all I command.

Moses said to the people: 'Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die"; and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."

## R. If today, you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us. Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. R.

Come in, let us kneel and bend low; let us kneel before the God who made us for he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture, the flock that is led by his hand. R.

O that today you would listen to his voice! 'Harden not your hearts as at Meribah, as on that day at Massah in the desert when your fathers put me to the test; when they tried me, though they saw my work.' R.

### **Second Reading** 1 Corinthians 7:32-35 (JB)

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

The unmarried woman dedicates herself to the things of the Lord, that she might be holy.

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to

pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

### **Gospel** *Mark* 1:21-28 (*JB*)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

This is a new kind of teaching that speaks with authority.

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.
