

Northern Beaches Review announcement

Dear Parishioners.

I am pleased to share with you that Mr Danny Casey, Director of Catholic Schools Broken Bay, announced on Friday the outcomes of the Northern Beaches Review into the provision of Catholic Education in the schools of our parish and those of the North Harbour parish.

Among the outcomes is that, from 2025, St Paul's will transition to become a co-educational school. Our Year 7 intake in 2025 will be our first co-ed enrolment (i.e. students that are in Year 4 this year). There will also be the option for girls to join Year 11, 2025. with the College to become fully co-ed by 2028.

It was also announced that St Mary's Manly will establish a specialised Stage 3 Hub, affording students in Years 5 & 6 access to specialist resources, staffing and learning spaces to shape their transition to secondary schooling and retain their enrolment in our system of schools.

Attached is the letter that was shared with the parents of the five schools within the review (St Mary's, St John the Baptist, St Kieran's, St Cecilia's and St Paul's) for your information.

This is a significant announcement and further communications from Catholic Schools Broken Bay will also detail how the recommendations of the review will play out at SJB, Manly Vale and Balgowlah.

The immediate task is for CSBB to develop both a detailed business and master plans for the St Mary's and St Paul's sites, which will be shared in due course with our parents, staff and parish communities.

With the school year concluding this Friday 16 December I take this chance to wish you a safe, happy and holy Christmas with your families.

Re: Announcement – Southern Peninsula of the Northern Beaches School Review

We are excited to provide an update on the status of the Southern Peninsula of the Northern Beaches School Review project.

This is a transformative, future focused initiative for Catholic education, and our families on the Northern Beaches, and with your input we are reimagining the way that Catholic education meets the needs of our community.

Your insights, feedback and ideas have directly informed the recommendations put forward to Bishop Anthony Randazzo by the Strategic Working Party and will be crucial to the long-term detailed plan that will be finalised next year.

These recommendations have received strong endorsement by Bishop Anthony and the CSBB Advisory Committee, and we are pleased to announce a summary of the outcomes of the review.

To strengthen and shape the future of our schools, Catholic Schools Broken Bay will:

- Progress a detailed education and business plan for the Northern Beaches
- Enhance opportunities for greater collaboration and learning across our system of schools
- Create a clear pathway from Preschool to Year 12 including:
 - exploration of additional preschool opportunities
 - creation of a K-12 co-educational precinct in Manly (K-6 St Mary's site and 7-12 at the current St Paul's site)
 - co-educational secondary school commencing in 2025 with Years 7 and 11, accepting enrolments from 2023
- Provide a Stage 3 (year 5 and 6) Learning Hub for Manly, giving our students greater access to specialist teachers and resources in preparation for high school.
- Commit significant investment in our schools and facilities to provide contemporary and innovative indoor and outdoor spaces for learning and sport.

In addition, the strategic working party will consider greater opportunities for student representative sports for CSBB schools. This will include the provision of improved sporting facilities for CSBB schools.

We are very grateful for your continued support and partnership in the future of Catholic Schools Broken Bay, as we inspire hearts and minds to know Christ, to love learning, to use their talents to be the very best they can be.

We look forward to progressing and delivering these recommendations.

Welcome to the NBRS Summer 2022 Newsletter

We have had a busy six months with 253 airfares. They have arrived from Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan, Ethiopia, Myanmar, South Sudan and Congo. The largest numbers were from Syria and Iraq.

The Northern Beaches Refugee Sanctuary started assisting with airfare loans in 2003. In that time we have assisted 7886 people from 47 different countries.

We are still seeing strong demand for assistance. The cost of airfares has almost doubled in the last six months. It costs about \$3,000 per person so a family of 6 will be almost \$18,000. We are limiting our loans to \$2,000 per person as we just don't have enough money. We have a waiting list of about 4 weeks.

The other large loan scheme, which has operated for may years, has now stopped lending.

Australia's refugee program was cut during the COVID outbreak. The numbers were reduced from 18,750 to 13,750. The Labor party's policy was an increase in allocation to 27,000 by 2025. This will significantly increase the demand for our assistance.

Sadly, the number of refugees in the world continues to rise. The war in Ukraine has caused a large refugee movement in Europe. It will increase the demand on our services. We will continue to help as many as we can.

This week we helped a family of 5 from Iraq. The sponsor was unable to raise the airfare as she was supporting the family in Iraq. We were able to help, her joy and happiness was infectious. It is such a stress on the sponsor. They are often newly arrived in Australia and want to support the refugee family. It doesn't make it easy to save the airfare. When the family arrive, they will need to settle into Australia's way of life. It is foreign to them and difficult to lean English. They have support of their family and the community but more importantly no one is trying to kill them; they also have food to eat and availability of medical care.

We also helped a family of three from Afghanistan. It is the second time we have helped the sponsor. The sponsor was an interpreter for the Australian Defense Force. He said the following...

And not to forget David Thank you so so much for your support and help. Because it is your organisation that helps me brought my family here to Australia and my family member have great life here in Australia. So thank you so so much.

We also helped a family of seven. They are the sponsors mother and his siblings. They are from South Sudan. The sponsor had saved for the flights but by the time the visas were granted the airfares had increased. We were able to help, and the family have now arrived. It will be a big celebration at Christmas.

We received an email which is below. I have removed the names.

I hope my email finds you in good health.

I would like to start by presenting myself. My cousin who has been talking to your good selves about our urgent need for your kind help and support regarding our tickets purchase which will enable us to arrive to Sydney Australia.

On Friday the 9th of September 2022, we received our IMMI Cards and Visas. In the visa grant notice was written that our prior entrance must be done before 14 October, otherwise it won't be possible to enter the country which we've been waiting for SO Months ago, my cousin talked to your good selves asking the financial support for this issue, and your kind reply was to send you our Immi cards to start the required procedures but at that time we didn't have them, but were so happy that you agreed to help. Your kind assistance and support are so much needed since we are not able to pay the amount of 4 adults tickets in cash right now , because we don't own it, although since we received the acceptance phone call from the embassy we tried our best to start working for the sake of this, but as you know the circumstance in Lebanon and their strict employment rules for Syrian Citizens (we are not allowed to work no one agreed to give us a chance to work even a part time job).

Honestly speaking we are afraid to lose this precious chance of arriving to Sydney if you don't accept to help us and we don't know anyone there who can.

Now we are looking forward to receive your kind approval of accepting to help us, as you've done once with my cousin when they needed a helping hand you did it without hesitation, we hope to receive the same help as well.

The email encapsulates our work and why we do it. Refugees who need help to escape and travel to Australia. They are so close to escaping but just need the airfare. They then repay it and we use it for the next family.

We are looking for donations if you can help. There is a large demand, and we don't have enough money to help everyone.

Donations are tax deductible and reused many times.

The average loan is outstanding for just over a year. Our bad debts are less than 1% of the cost of the airfare.

Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, and said 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit.
