### **SCRIPTURE REFLECTION**

As we look forward to Christmas, quickly approaching, today's readings speak of God's plans: for the House of David, for Mary, and for us.

In the **First Reading**, David resolves to build a house for God, but God, who has journeyed with his people through all their ups and downs, has different plans. Speaking through the prophet Nathan, God promises to build a house for the people of Israel, establishing David as head of the dynasty and providing security to his people for generations to come. Jesus himself will eventually spring from this House of David, which will continue to the end of time.

The **Psalmist** begins by expressing his joy in God's everlasting love and support, then speaks of God's faithful and enduring love. He echoes the promise God makes to David (First Reading). St Paul gives praise to God, whose plan, hidden for so long, has now been revealed in Jesus. Through Jesus's birth, death and resurrection, we are offered salvation. Paul urges us to share this news with as many as possible. **(Second Reading)** 

We hear Jesus's name spoken at the beginning of the **Gospel**, where Luke describes how the angel comes to Mary with good news. Gabriel tells of God's plan: through Mary, a virgin, the son of God will be born; a successor to the House of David, whose reign will never end. Mary shows her faith and trust in God by responding with an unconditional yes.

Perhaps we can pray this week, especially in these unusual times, to be always aware of God's faithful presence and love. To ask for the graces of humility, trust, and openness to God that we see Mary herself express. *Pathways to God*





Jesus Christ, our beginning and end: A Pastoral Letter from Bishop Anthony Randazzo to the community of the Church of Broken Bay 2020 – 2021

Bishop Anthony issued his first Pastoral Letter to the Diocese of Broken Bay on Sunday 29 November, for the First Sunday of Advent. Entitled **Jesus Christ**,

our beginning and end, it outlines the Bishop's six priorities for the community of the Church in our Diocese. Books are available in both Church's.

Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you . . . Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you shall conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus." Luke 1: 26-38

Today's Gospel: On this Sunday before Christmas is Luke's account of the angel Gabriel's appearance to Mary. The Annunciation story is filled with Old Testament imagery (e.g., the announcement by the angel parallels the announcements of the births of many key figures in salvation history, such as Isaac and Samuel; the "overshadowing" of Mary recalls the cloud of glory covering the tent of the ark and temple in Jerusalem). Mary's yes to Gabriel's words set the stage for the greatest event in human history: God's becoming human.

**Reflection:** In today's Gospel, God begins the "Christ event" with Mary, a simple Jewish girl who is at the very bottom of her people's social ladder; the God who created all things makes the fulfillment of his promise dependent upon one of the most dispossessed and powerless of his creatures. Yet God exalts her humility, her simplicity, her trust in his love and mercy. God's "favor" belongs the poor, the rejected, the abandoned and the forgotten among us today.

In his becoming human in the Son of Mary, God enters human history is show us how to live God-like, grace-filled, holy lives of compassion, forgiveness and justice in our time and place in that history.

In the Advents of our lives, God calls us to bring his Christ into our own time and place; may we respond with the faith and trust of Mary, putting aside our own doubts and fears to say *I am your servant*, *O God. Be it done*.

The mystery of the Incarnation is relived every time we echo Mary's "yes" to God's call to bring his Christ into our world, when we accept, as did Mary, God's asking us to make the Gospel Jesus alive in our own time and place.

Mary's life is pretty much laid out before her by her family and culture — simple, hidden and uncomplicated. But God interrupts her preordered life, entrusting her with bringing his Christ to birth. God interrupts our own well-ordered and focused lives, as well, to bring his Word and Light to birth in our hearts and homes; God's messenger Gabriel appears to us in the needs of our children, the struggles of family and friends, the cries of the poor, the despair of the lost and marginalized.

### A letter to the People in the Diocese of Broken Bay

# Tuesday 15th December 2020

Throughout this year our world has experienced historic disruption with the spread of the COVID19 virus. Many people's lives have been

deeply affected. We think, especially, of those who have fallen sick with the virus and those who have died, their families, and those who cared for them - many, many thousands across the world. Economies, too, have suffered: people continue to struaale financially. I am acutely aware of the toll on people's mental health that the year has occasioned. In a few weeks' time we begin a new year, and our faith helps us to look forward with hope.

The life of our community of the Church has also undergone remarkable dislocation. What one year ago would have unimaginable came to pass: for several months, our churches were closed; we were not able to gather for the Eucharist; we could not gather to celebrate Easter. record my deepest gratitude to our priests, deacons, and the Faithful who kept the flame of faith burning brightly throughout that COVID winter. I continue to be moved by the of how our communities connected using new technologies and by the diliaence that our demonstrated throughout that period towards the people entrusted to their care.

We cannot but salute our civil authorities for the way in which they have ensured the safety of our Australian community throughout the crisis of the pandemic. As the virus has thankfully become more contained in our own country, restrictions on gatherings have been able to be eased. With the recent changes announced by the NSW Government in early December, many of our parish communities are now able to gather in a way that is reminiscent of the time before the pandemic. This enables us to approach the celebration of Christmas with anticipation and Nevertheless, we will still need to be vigilant in care of one another by maintaining

some of the safe-behaviours that have thus far served us well.

In my Decree of 18 March 2020, in response to the crisis of the pandemic, I dispensed the Faithful of the Diocese of Broken Bay from the ordinary obligation to be present at the Sunday Eucharist. Now, with the welcome situation that has developed, with gratitude to God, I rescind that Decree, and call upon and encourage the Faithful to resume their obligations as part of the living Body of Christ. Under Canon 1247, the Faithful are now once more obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and the Holy Days of Christmas and the Assumption. Notwithstanding, those who are aged or have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risk of COVID19 are free to remain at home, honouring the Lord's Day through the best way open to them. Some examples are participating in the live-streamed Mass, private prayer, reading the Scripture, praying the Rosary.

In so reaffirming our obligation to participate in the Mass, the source and summit of our life, recognise Christian we again tangibly importance of expressing communion of life in Christ. Each of us is a living and vital member of the Body of Christ. Our coming together as the community of the Church, to give praise to the Father through Christ in the Spirit, defines our identity. the Fathers of the Church were apt to declare, the Church makes the Eucharist and the makes Church! Eucharist the Though technology has enabled us to remain connected, such presentations can never replace the significance of the physical gathering of the community of faith in the Eucharist by which we see and hear and touch the communion into which we are invited by the Lord.

So, now let us gather as disciples of the Risen Lord and come back together to worship the Lord through the sacred celebration of the Mass. I pray that our commemoration of the birth of Jesus this year may be one of faith, and may it be filled with the love, joy, and peace of Christ.

### FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT - Year B

**First Reading** 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8-12, 14, 16

A reading from the second book of Samuel

The kingdom of David will be established for ever in the sight of the Lord.

Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go and do all that is in your mind, for the Lord is with you.' But that very night the word of the Lord came to Nathan: 'Go and tell my servant David, "Thus the Lord speaks: Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, to be leader of my people Israel; I have been with you on all your expeditions; I have cut off all your enemies before you. I will give you fame as great as the fame of the greatest on earth. I will provide a place for my people Israel; I will plant them there and they shall dwell in that place and never be disturbed again; nor shall the wicked continue to oppress them as they did, in the days when I appointed judges over my people Israel; I will give them rest from all their enemies. The Lord will make you great; the Lord will make you a House. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke You will conceive and bear a son.

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.
