Fourth Sunday of Easter - 11th May 2025

Threefold Blessing: Honouring Mothers, Christ the Shepherd, and the Church's Future

This weekend brings together three profound moments in the life of our Church and community.

First, we celebrate **Mother's Day**—a time to give thanks for the women in our lives who have nurtured us with love, strength, and wisdom. Whether our mothers are still with us or have gone before us, we honour the sacrifices they've made, the faith they've passed on, and the unconditional care they've shown. In so many ways, their love echoes the care of Christ, the Good Shepherd.

Which brings us to our second celebration: **Good Shepherd Sunday.** In today's Gospel (John 10:27–30), Jesus says, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life; they will never be lost." Christ, the Good Shepherd, knows each of us by name. He walks with us, leads us, and holds us securely in his love. It's a powerful reminder that even in uncertain times, we are not alone. We are held in the hand of the Shepherd who never abandons his flock.

This brings us to the third moment of significance: the beginning of the **conclave** to elect a new pope. As the cardinals gather in prayer and discernment, we join with Catholics around the world in asking the Holy Spirit to guide their hearts. We pray that a new shepherd will emerge—one who listens deeply to the voice of Jesus and is ready to lead with wisdom, courage, and compassion. This is truly a Good Shepherd moment for the Church, and we entrust it entirely to the Spirit of God.

So let us carry all of this in prayer this weekend—thankful for our mothers, trusting in Christ our Shepherd, and hopeful for the one who will soon be called to shepherd the Church.

Part 3 - The Idea of Resurrection Prior to Christianity

This week, we continue exploring the evidence for the Resurrection. In Parts 1 and 2, we examined the authenticity and reliability of the New Testament Scriptures, the discovery of the empty tomb, and the remarkable growth of Christianity in the face of intense persecution. Now, we turn to how the



Christian concept of resurrection was a radically new idea—unprecedented in both ancient pagan religions and Jewish theological thought.

As Pope Benedict XVI observes, the Gospel accounts strongly emphasise that Jesus' resurrected form is neither a "ghost" nor a mere "spirit." This is evident in the passages where Jesus is seen participating in meals—(i) at Emmaus, (ii) in the upper room, and (iii) on the shore. Nor is He simply a resuscitated corpse who has returned to earthly life. Rather, as Paul describes, the Resurrected Christ possesses a "spiritual body" (Greek: pneumatikon soma)—a transformed, glorified corporeality that was entirely unknown in both Jewish and pagan worldviews.


Scripture scholar N.T. Wright notes that while visions of the dead were common in the ancient world, these were never interpreted—whether in Roman, Greek, or Oriental religions—as a bodily resurrection in the Christian sense. In Greco-Roman beliefs, the soul might persist after death in the underworld (Hades), but this was not seen as a return to bodily life. Some traditions even allowed for reincarnation or the transmigration of souls—where a soul moved from one body to another. The ancient Egyptians believed in an afterlife realm called the Duat, and mummification rituals were designed to assist the soul's journey there. In Mesopotamian mythology, gods such as Tammuz (or Dumuzi), associated with fertility and agriculture, were thought to die and rise again each year—a symbolic cycle linked to nature, not to actual resurrection.

Similarly, Wright argues, Jewish beliefs about resurrection differed significantly from the Christian understanding. For example: Resurrection was envisioned as a return to the same kind of bodily life as before death, but only in the future, in a renewed world of the righteous. In Jewish eschatology (i.e. End Times), this resurrection would occur at the end of the world, during the Messianic Age. In contrast, Christians believe that this new age has already begun in Christ and will be completed in the future once all the righteous are raised to life with Christ in a new spiritual body.

Importantly, no Jewish tradition suggested that the Messiah would rise from the dead before the inauguration of the Messianic Age.

In summary, across all ancient religions—including Judaism—there is no precedent for the Christian claim of bodily resurrection into a new, spiritual form in this present world. What the disciples testified to was a completely unprecedented experience in human history and mythology. This uniqueness, in itself, stands as a compelling piece of evidence for the Resurrection of Jesus as witnessed by His followers.



Fourth Sunday of Easter - Year C

First Reading

Acts 13:14, 43-52 (JB)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

We are now turning to the gentiles.

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to the synagogue on the sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up, many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God has given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly. 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said:

I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

Gospel Reflection

Christ the Good Shepherd calls us to listen consciously, deliberately, wisely for his voice in the depths of our hearts, to listen for his voice in the love and joy, the pain and



anguish, the cries for mercy and justice of those around us; Christ the Son of God assures us that we are always safe and accepted in the loving embrace of his Father.

Christ speaks in many voices — including our own. We can be the "voice" of Christ's compassion, comfort, forgiveness and peace in even our smallest and simplest words and acts of kindness and generosity.

Jesus calls each one of us to take on the role of "shepherd": to walk and lead one another through the steep paths and dangerous ridges we all must walk, not diminishing the danger or pain but helping one another make our way through it. The challenge of taking up the Good Shepherd's staff is to face the truth despite our own fears, to search for God's light (if only a flicker) in the midst of overwhelming darkness, to reach out to grab another despite our own tenuous grasp.


