

Fifth Sunday of Easter - 2nd May 2021



Gospel Reading:

From the music of the psalms to the engravings on the temple pediments, vines were a symbol of God's many blessings to Israel. In his Last Supper discourse (from which today's Gospel is taken), Jesus appropriates the image of the vine to explain his eternal connectedness to his disciples, their connectedness through him to God, and their connectedness to one another.

Reflection: In Christ, we are "grafted" to God and to one another. The Risen One calls us to community, to be branches on the same vine, to realize our life in Christ is also life in one another.

We cannot live our faith in a vacuum: Unless Jesus becomes the center of our lives, the faith we profess is doomed to wither and die in emptiness.

The Easter season speaks to us of the eternal presence of Christ in our midst, present to us in the Word we have heard and has taken root in our hearts. Our faithfulness to the call to discipleship demands that we work to enable that Word within us to produce a "yield" of compassion, forgiveness, justice and reconciliation. In the "fruit" we bear as "branches" of Christ do we glorify God the "vine grower."

ST ATHANASIUS FEAST DAY 2nd May

St. Athanasius, Patron Saint of Manly also known as Athanasius the Great and Athanasius the Confessor, was a bishop and doctor of the Church. He is called the "Father of Orthodoxy," the "Pillar of the Church" and "Champion of Christ's Divinity." Athanasius became one of the most dedicated opponents of the heresy of Arianism. Much of his life was a testimony to the divinity of Jesus Christ.



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This Saturday, 1 May, we commemorate the second feast of St Joseph in our liturgical calendar. It is the feast of St Joseph the Worker. On 19 March, the Solemnity of St Joseph, Spouse of Mary, I installed and blessed a statue of St Joseph in Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, and on Saturday I will be opening and blessing a newly established house of discernment for young men, named "Joseph House". I announced this initiative on 8 December 2020, the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church and am pleased to be able to see the project come to fruition on the feast of St Joseph the Worker. It is a project that I have dedicated to the intercession of the earthly father of Jesus in this year of Saint Joseph.

The House will be a place for young men to uncover the call to holiness that comes through baptism, whilst spending some serious time in discernment and contemplation, while being active in the world. The aim is that they can meet the challenge of living as Christian men in a fruitful environment, under the guidance of St Joseph as a great role model of virtue and character.

On Saturday 17 April, I convened a meeting of the Plenary Council delegates and animators from across the Diocese for the first time since the pandemic began. The aim was to reanimate the Plenary Council initiative, to provide formation on this theme and to commission the four delegates for the Diocese of Broken Bay – Alison Newell, Raj Rajasingam, Danny Casey, and Fr David Ranson.

Until our gatherings were interrupted by COVID-19, the Diocese of Broken Bay was recognised as one of the highest responders to the Plenary Council invitation to "Listen to what the Spirit is saying" to the Church in Australia. The Council is an opportunity for a holy listening, a truthful speaking, and a dialogue of love. I look forward to continuing the journey of the Plenary Council with the many enthusiastic people who are generously engaged in this task.

My presentation on the Plenary Council day has been produced as a video resource for use throughout the Diocese and can be accessed here. I hope that you might find it of use also for our ongoing mission of evangelisation in Broken Bay. #783707v1.

As we journey in the Easter Season, we also continue to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation. More specifically, we are entering into celebration the the of Sacrament of Confirmation. Ι grateful, the am after restrictions of COVID last year, to be travelling to parishes and conferring the Sacrament of Confirmation for the first time in the Diocese. I know that many of our young people have been waiting patiently in anticipation of this moment of grace. I hope that it will be a time of bringing to life the power of the Holy Spirit in them and in our community of the Church. Thank you to all families and carers, catechists and teachers, and deacons who have priests been accompanying the young candidates. May God bless you all abundantly.

Fifth Sunday of Easter – YEAR B

First Reading

Acts 9:26-31 (JB)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

He explained how the Lord appeared to Saul and spoke to him on his journey.

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

1 John 3:18-24

A reading from the first letter of St John

His commandments are these: that we believe and that we love one another.

My children, our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active; only by this can we be certain that we are the children of the truth and be able to quieten our conscience in his presence, whatever accusations it may raise against us, because God is greater than our conscience and he knows everything. My dear people, if we cannot be condemned by our own conscience, we need not be afraid in God's presence, and whatever we ask him, we shall receive, because we keep his commandments and live the kind of life that he wants. His commandments are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to. Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him. We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

John 15:1-8 (JB)


A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

All who live in me, and I in them, bear much fruit.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more. You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away - he withers; these branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'
