Fifth Sunday of Lent - 6th April 2025



Gospel Reflection

The story of the adulteress is a later addition to John's Gospel. A cherished tale from the then rich oral history of Jesus' life, it was added to John's text probably in the third century.

Once again, the scribes and Pharisees set up a trap to discredit Jesus. According to the Mosaic code, adultery was considered among the gravest of sins, punishable by death; but the law of the Roman occupiers forbade the Jewish authorities to impose and carry out the death sentence on anyone. The dilemma facing Jesus, then, is this: If Jesus condemns the woman, he undermines his own teachings on forgiveness and puts him in conflict with the Roman authority; if he does not condemn her, he breaks faith with the covenant Law.

Jesus' response to their hypocrisy challenges the Jews' understanding of judgment and authority: God reserves the role of judging others to himself; to us belongs the work of forgiveness and reconciliation. God's commandments are addressed to each one of us as individuals to keep. We are called to judge our own actions and pass sentence on our own lives.

While the scribes and Pharisees view authority as a license to criticize, ensure and condemn this woman, Jesus sees authority as a gift for transforming her life and reconciling her with God. Connectionsmediaworks.com

St John Vianney, Patron Saint of Priests

St John Vianney was chosen by the Church to be the patron saint of priests because of the exemplary dedication to his pastoral duties and the transformative impact he had on his parish community in the village of Ars, France.



Born on May 8, 1786 in Dardilly, France, John Baptiste Marie Vianney grew up in a devout catholic home during the French Revolution, a time of great social upheaval and anti-Catholic sentiment. Vianney recounts how impressed he was by the heroism of the priests and nuns who continued to serve the catholic faithful in secret at the risk of their own lives.

One day during an underground Mass he felt called to the priesthood, saying to himself "If I am to be a priest, I will win many souls for God." He left the family farm at the age of 20 to begin his studies but really struggled due to poor schooling and the upheavals caused by the civil war. He would eventually be ordained a priest in 1825, at the age of 39.

He was assigned as parish priest of Ars, and was shocked by the devastation that the Revolution had wrought on the people's faith and morals. So he made it his mission to transform the parish community by his inspirational preaching, exhortations to virtue, and spending many hours hearing confessions (up to 16 hours) all while fasting on a harsh diet of two boiled potatoes a day, a piece of bread, as well as many acts of penance besides. Many miracles happened through Vianney's intercession. He was also know for having the gift of reading souls. As such, fame of him spread throughout France and beyond, and many sought him out for confession and spiritual guidance.

As a result of his success, Vianney suffered intense spiritual battles, including being physically attacked by the devil, who even set his bed on fire. The devil once said to him, "if there were only three like you in France I would not be able to set foot there." However, Vianney longed for the contemplative life, and on four occasions tried running away from Ars to become a monk, eventually realising it was God's will that he stay and serve his parishioners.

Vianney died at the age of 73, and was canonised by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Pope John XXIII dedicated a whole encyclical to Vianney (1959), and Pope Benedict XVI inaugurated the Year of Priests on the 150th anniversary of his death (2009-2010). St John Vianney's incorrupt body and heart lie in the Basilica of Ars.







A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians

Because of Christ I look upon everything else as useless in order to gain him.

For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I can assure you my

brothers, I am far from thinking that I have already won. All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.

As they persisted with their question, he looked up and said, 'If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.' Then he bent down and wrote on the ground again. When they heard this they went away one by one, beginning with the eldest, until Jesus was left alone with the woman, who remained standing there. He looked up and said, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' 'No one, sir,' she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus 'go away, and don't sin any more.'
