



Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - 13th February 2022

GOSPEL REFLECTION

In Matthew's Sermon on the Mount, Jesus speaks of "Beatitudes," but in Luke's Sermon on the Plain, Jesus drops a series of bombshells. He takes the accepted standards of the times and turns them upside down: To those who are considered the "haves" of society, Jesus warns "Woe to you!" - wealth and power are not the stuff of the kingdom of God; but to the "have nots," Jesus says, "Happy and blessed are love, humble selflessness, compassion and generosity are the treasure of God's realm. Jesus promises his followers poverty, suffering, persecuting and grief --



but their hope in God will be rewarded with perfect and complete joy. In Luke's Gospel, the "blessed" are those who see beyond their own needs and wants in the present moment to work for a better future not only for themselves but for others — but "woe" to those, Jesus warns, who seek their own "fill" now with no concern for the future or for others.

This will be a constant theme throughout Luke's Gospel: Jesus teaches that wealth and power are not the stuff of the reign of God, but humility, selflessness and compassion are the treasures of God's kingdom.







A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

The Lord says this: 'A curse on the man who puts his trust in man, who relies on things of flesh, whose heart turns from the Lord. He is like dry scrub in the wastelands: if good comes, he has no eyes for it, he settles in the parched places of the wilderness, a salt land, uninhabited. 'A blessing on the man who puts his trust in the Lord, with the Lord for his hope. He is like a tree by the waterside that thrusts its roots to the stream: when the heat comes it feels no alarm, its foliage stays green; it has no worries in a year of drought, and never ceases to bear fruit.'
