Today's readings teach us that true happiness, or beatitude, lies in the awareness that we are all children of a loving Heavenly Father and that we will be happy only when we share our blessings with our brothers and sisters in need, and when we work to uplift them, thus declaring our "*option for the poor*," as Jesus did.

Contrary to the popular belief, wealth, power and influence are not the source of true happiness. Luke's version of the Beatitudes challenges our consumeroriented society today. While wealth, power and fame are the sought-after prizes of our world, the treasures of God's reign are love, selflessness, compassion and generosity.

In freeing ourselves from the pursuit of the things of this world, we liberate ourselves to seek the lasting things of God.

Jesus is speaking to the economically poor who were reduced to begging. The richer members of the community failed in their covenant with God by not coming to the rescue of the poor. When this happened, God sided with the poor and spoke on their behalf.

Blessed are the poor... and woe to the rich: The poor are not blest because they are materially destitute. Rather, they are blest because they are able to place their trust in God in the midst of poverty. The rich are not cursed simply because they are materially well off, but because of their failure to come to the rescue of the poor by generously sharing with them. Blessed are the hungry, woe to the full: Jesus says we are blessed if we can keep trusting in God in empty/hungry times.

It is also a blessing if we are hungry for God's love. It is a curse if our "plenty times" lead us to ignore God. *Blessed are you if weeping, ... woe if laughing*: It is a blessing if we mourn for the injustices in our world. It is not a curse to be happy. But it is a curse if our laughter is at the expense of others; or to become rich at the expense of others. *Blessed are you if people hate you... woe if people speak well of you:* We are blessed if society reject us because of our love for Jesus. Poverty, hunger, tears and rejection are not to be sought after. But if they come to us as a result of our following Jesus, then they are blessings because we turn to God and follow his ways. Jesus challenges us to embrace his new life vision: to seek the common good, to bring compassion and forgiveness to others, to seek the lasting things of God. We are called to respond to the challenges of the beatitudes in our daily life. *Fr Tony Kadavil 2019*

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER


Friday 1st March 2019 ~ 10.00 am Morning tea will follow the prayer service

WORLD YOUTH DAY 2019 by Ivica Covic

"My dear young people. We adults often have a habit of telling you: 'you are the future.' But here I am going to say something different. You are not the future, but the now of God!"

How special are these words that Pope Francis spoke during his homily at the Final Mass in Panama to conclude our World Youth Day pilgrimage.

Empowered by God's love, the Holy Father gave us this encouragement: **"Go back to** your parishes and communities, to your families and your friends, and share this experience, so that others can resonate with the strength and enthusiasm that is yours."

World Youth Day 2019, I can openly say, has been one of the best experiences of my life, and one that I will remember forever. What helped make it so special was feeling so close to God and the Church, and seeing others transform and feel the same.

There were 65 pilgrims from the Diocese of Broken Bay, including our own Fr Paul and Simon Hyland. We left Sydney on January 16th headed for Mexico.

There we started our pilgrimage to prepare ourselves for World Youth Day week in Panama. Highlights in Mexico included visiting Our Lady of Guadalupe as well as many other Cathedrals and Churches. We also had various cultural experiences such as visiting the Temple of the Sun and Moon of the Aztecs. We then travelled to Panama for the start of the World Youth Day festivities, beginning with the Opening Mass. For the next few days, Broken Bay, were given the opportunity to be 'animators' which involved organising three days of catechesis. Catechesis involved listening to testimonies from Bishops and pilgrims, singing, dancing and reflecting. Reconciliation was available, and we were also able to participate in Adoration. A huge thank you to Simon who not only helped coordinate catechesis sessions, but also helped with singing and many other tasks



throughout World Youth Day to make sure that this Pilgrimage was as fruitful as it was. We went to Mass every day on our Pilgrimage, whether at а Church, Houston Airport Chapel or at our accommodation. Other events throughout World Youth Day week included the Pope's welcome, the Stations of the Cross, and my highlight: The Vigil and Final Mass. After World Youth Day week was over, we travelled to Gamboa Rainforest for our retreat, which was a much-needed time for reflection, prayer and thanksgiving.

What made the whole journey so special was seeing all these young people from around the world in Panama for the same reason – to be witnesses to the

Gospel and to share in God's love. It gave me goosebumps, seeing around a million people at the Vigil and Final Mass, each praying and talking in their own languages – yet it felt like we were all speaking the same language. Everyone was so joyful throughout our whole pilgrimage and being able to share in this joy and love for God was incredible!
