Gospel Reflection The Spirit of truth, "whom the world cannot accept," illuminates our vision and opens our hearts to discern the will and wisdom of

God. The Spirit/Paraclete "advocates" for what is good, what is right and what is just, despite our skepticism, rejection and blindness to the things of God.

The Risen Christ challenges us, in the gift of the "Spirit of truth," not to approach truth in terms of profit, power, comfort or convention, but to embrace the truth of God's justice and compassion present in our world.

Throughout his Gospel, the writer of John's Gospel never allows love, as taught by Jesus, to remain at the level of sentiment or emotion. Its expression is always highly moral and is revealed in obedience to the will of the Father. To love as Jesus loved – in total and selfless obedience, without conditions and without expectation of that love ever being returned – is the difficult love that Jesus expects of those who claim to be his disciples.

The Spirit of truth is the creative, living memory of the Church. Through that "living memory," the Church enters into the mystery of Christ himself. Jesus, the wise Rabbi, the compassionate Healer, the Friend of rich and poor and said and sinner, the obedient and humble Servant of God, is a living presence among us to give us hope, strength and light as we struggle to balance and direct our lives until he calls us to the new life of his Resurrection.

PASTORAL WORKS APPEAL

As many will know, at this time of year we conduct the final of 3 tranches of the PASTORAL WORKS BROKEN BAY APPEAL or PWBB (formerly the CHARITABLE WORKS FUND).

However, with the great support of some very generous donors we have already exceeded (by more than \$3,000) the target of \$43,846 set for our Parish by the Diocese in FY23.

Some parishioners may still wish to donate (and take advantage of the 100% tax deduction available) as the recipients of these funds have a continuing need.

As a reminder the appeal supports 4 specific programs which the Diocese runs:

- Hospital Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care Program

- St Lucy's School and St Edmund's College- serving students with disabilities
- The Ephpheta Centre- which provides support and advocacy for the deaf community

Sixth Sunday of Easter – Year A

First Reading

Acts 8:5-8, 14-17 (JB)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who

ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.

Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.
