

## Gospel Reflection

In his Last Supper discourse, Jesus leaves his fledgling Church his gift of peace and the

promise of the Spirit. Christ's gift of peace is not the absence of trouble and hostility ("as the world gives peace"); Christ's peace is the Scriptural concept of **shalom,** meaning the pursuit of everything which makes for the highest good. The peace of Christ finds its core in the Gospel principles of humble servanthood and holy justice.

The "Advocate" (or "Paraclete," as found in some translations of John's Gospel), who intercedes and intervenes on behalf of good, is the exact opposite of the "adversary," Satan. The Advocate/Paraclete is that presence of God within us that opens our hearts and minds to the promptings of God's Word as proclaimed by Jesus. *Connectionmediaworks.com*

#### The Shroud of Turin: Burial Cloth of Jesus

The Shroud of Turin is perhaps the most sacred and studied relic in the Catholic Church. It bears the faint image of a man who appears to have suffered the wounds of crucifixionmatching the descriptions found in the Gospels. Many believe it to be the actual burial cloth of



Jesus Christ. Over the years, the Shroud has become the most intensely researched artefact in history. However, public interest seemed to wane after a 1988 scientific study used carbon-14 dating to conclude that the cloth originated in the fourteenth century, between 1260 and 1390 AD. This appeared to disprove the idea that the Shroud could be from the time of Christ.

Yet, in recent years, several scientific studies have challenged those 1988 results. Critics have raised concerns about the reliability of the carbon dating, pointing to likely contamination of the samples, the questionable location from which the sample was taken (from a medieval repair), and flaws in the testing methodology itself. More advanced dating techniques have since emerged. One of the most notable is WAXS Analysis (Wide-Angle X-ray Scattering), a method used to date linen by studying the molecular structure of the linen.

In 2022, a team scientists led by Italian Dr. Liberato De Caro used WAXS to analyse a sample of the Shroud. They concluded that the linen's structure closely matches that of other fabrics known to be from the first century. Their findings were published in the scientific journal Heritage on April 11, 2022. A study by a separate team from the University of Padua also supports the conclusion that the cloth is consistent with a first-century origin.

But the mystery of the image on the Shroud is far more **significant** than questions about its age. Australian expert William West has highlighted several unique and puzzling features:

- The image is a high-resolution, 3D encoded, photographic negative, which no known artistic method from history can replicate.
- The image appears to have been formed by a burst of electromagnetic radiation coming from the body itself something no natural process has been able to explain nor replicate.
- · Blood stains on the cloth contain the chemical bilirubin, consistent with a person who endured extreme physical trauma, such as torture.
- Microscopic analysis has revealed pollen grains from plants native to Jerusalem and traces of rare soil also found in that region.
- The wounds and blood clot stains on the cloth show no signs of disturbance, suggesting that the cloth was not removed or peeled away from the body, but rather the body had vanished or transformed — a claim consistent with the Gospel accounts of the Resurrection.
- Numerous other details have been identified and written in articles and books on the Shroud that shows how closely it aligns with the biblical description of Jesus' suffering, death, Alfred Soliman Seminarian and resurrection.

21 May 2025

The Jubilee Year of Hope continues through the Petrine ministry of Pope Leo XIV.

Greeting more than 200,000 pilgrims, representatives of Christian denominations, and leaders from around the world, at his Mass of inauguration in St Peter's Square last Sunday, Pope Leo XIV expressed his heartfelt gratitude for the prayerful and joyful support as he begins his pastoral ministry as Pope.

"I was chosen, without any merit of my own, and now, with fear and trembling," said Pope Leo, "I come to you as a brother, who desires to be the servant of your faith and your joy, walking with you on the path of God's love, for he wants us all to be united in one family."

Pope Leo XIV recalled how love and unity are the two aspects of the mission entrusted to Peter by Jesus.

Next week, 31 May, we celebrate The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary when Mary, pregnant with Jesus, visits her cousin Elizabeth, who was pregnant with John the Baptist.

The Visitation of Mary signifies her humility, willingness to serve God, and the joy of welcoming Jesus into the world. It also highlights the importance of charity, spreading the Gospel, and the Church's missionary nature.

On this day we will also celebrate the Patroness of the Diocese of Broken Bay, Mary Star of the Sea.

Star of the Sea is an ancient title for the Mother of Jesus Christ and comes down to us from the Latin *Stella Maris*. Under this title, Mary intercedes as both guide and protector for all those who travel or seek their livelihoods on or by the sea. As a faith community whose borders skirt both the Pacific Ocean and the Brisbane Waters, Mary is our guiding star and the model of discipleship as the mother of the Church.

Recognising the Patronal Feast Day, Bishop Anthony is hosting the **Inaugural Diocesan Awards Gala Dinner and Presentation** on **Friday 30 May 2025** which will also feature the inaugural Diocesan Oration.



First Reading

Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 (JB)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and ourselves not to burden you beyond what is essential.

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'



Second Reading Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23 (JB)

A reading from the book of the Apocalypse

He showed me the holy city coming down out of heaven.

In the spirit, the angel took me to the top of an enormous high mountain and showed me Jerusalem, the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven. It had all the radiant glory of God and glittered like some precious jewel or crystal-clear diamond. The walls of it were of a great height, and had twelve gates; at each of the twelve gates there was an angel, and over the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of one of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it.


