Dear Friends

It's been a while since I've spoken with you, but a lot has been happening in our parish.

It is encouraging to see more parishioners feeling confident about returning to weekend and weekday Masses. Both our Churches have plenty of space and are well ventilated, with mask wearing and sanitizing of hands. I believe that our Churches are as safe as any other place you may visit. I look forward to seeing you in Church.

The Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) has raised the important issue of inviting new members to join the PPC which advises the parish priest about the various pastoral needs of the parish community. I invite you to give prayerful consideration to the work of the PPC and whether you or someone you know can find the time to be a member of this important parish body. We need new members with new ideas and new vision.

The Parish Finance Committee (PFC) has reviewed our financial situation from pre Covid to the present time. Parish income for the support of our priests (1st Collection) and the running costs of the parish (2nd Collection) have dropped significantly due to Covid and a drop in Mass attendance. Parish finances are tight. I thank all of you who are doing your best to continue to support the finances of the parish. I refer you to the notice in the parish bulletin on page 4 on how to make your donation to the parish. There will be further information later.

With the children returning to school our CCD Catechists will soon be teaching the Catholic children in the State Schools. I thank them for their generosity with their time and the wisdom of their faith. Please keep them in your prayers and also pray for the teachers in our Parish Schools.

The Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA) which prepares adults for baptism and full membership of the Church will be resuming soon. We have several enquirers whom I will be in contact with.



St Mary's School News...



The Greek word for love used in this text is *agape*, a sense of benevolence, kindness and charity towards others. In other words, no matter what a person does to us we will never allow ourselves to seek anything but the highest good for him or her. The radical love of God that is the mark of the Christian is presented clearly and emphatically here.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus calls us not just to passive adherence to the standard of the "Golden Rule," but to actively seek out the good in everyone, to risk being duped or hurt in our compassion and forgiveness of another. The completeness and limitlessness of God's own love and mercy for us should be the measure of our love and mercy for one another.



Vox Episcopi – The Voice of the Bishop 16 February 2022

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, Greetings and blessings from Rome!

The streets and cafes are a lot quieter from my previous visits here as some health restrictions are still in place.

Although I have studied in Rome and lived and worked in the Vatican for a number of years, there is always something very special about returning here, visiting and praying in the Papal Basilica of St Peter in the Vatican which holds such a unique position in the Christian world.

The number of pilgrims is growing slowly each day that I have been here, and it is hoped that as people gain more confidence and the effects of the pandemic begin to stabilise, the large numbers of pilgrims usually seen at any time during the year either queuing in St Peter's Square or souvenir shopping in the side streets will soon return.

Hopefully many people will start to plan for pilgrimages to our holy places, including Rome, as the Church prepares for World Youth Day in 2023 and the Holy Year in 2025. Might we also begin to consider how as a Diocese we will approach these milestones?

St Peter's is one of four Major Basilicas in Rome, but it is considered one of the holiest Catholic shrines. It is here we find St Peter's burial site.

Although we knew St Peter the Apostle died a martyr in Rome and a church had been built over a small shrine believed to mark his burial place, it was not until 1968 that St Paul VI announced that the relics of St Peter had been "identified in a way which we can hold to be convincing", after the bones were discovered following excavations of the necropolis under St Peter's Basilica, which began in the 1940's near a monument erected in the fourth century to honour the great Apostle.

A visit to St Peter's Basilica provides an opportunity to marvel at the amazing Renaissance engineering feat, the magnificent artworks and sculptures, sit quietly in prayer in one of the many chapels in the massive interior or to join a Vatican Scavi Tour to see the Tomb of St Peter. I always find my visit to be a moving experience.

The Vatican is also the home of Pope Francis, the Apostolic Palace being his official residence.

This week, along with many clergy and laity from around the world, I attended the Symposium Priesthood at the Vatican.

Esteemed church leaders and academics gave rich and wide-ranging presentations – including reflections on tradition and new horizons; Trinity, mission and sacramentality; the challenges of formation; the missionary spirit and the culture of Vocation.

Pope Francis gave the opening lecture and spoke to us on *Faith and the Priesthood Today*. The Symposium has provided much to reflect upon, discuss and share with you when I return.

I also managed to catch up with the Australian Ambassador to the Holy See, Ms Chiara Porro.

The youngest ambassador the Vatican has ever welcomed as part of its diplomatic core, Ambassador Porro was keen to hear "first-hand news from home" and how we have coped during the pandemic and lockdowns. We also discussed the question of Religious Freedom, which is another hot topic for us in Australia, and in many parts of the world.

I will be returning to Broken Bay at the end of next week. Please be assured that I remember you at Mass and that I have prayed for you, your families and loved ones before the altar at St Peter's.

First Reading 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23 A reading the first book of Samuel

The Lord has put you in my power, but I will not raise my hand against you.

Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph. So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him. Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice.' David answered Abishai, 'Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt?' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them. David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David then called out, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. Today the Lord put you in my power, but I would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed.'
