# ALL SAINTS - 1st November 2020

Dear Friends,

As you may recall, in December 2018 it was discovered that there was extensive corrosion in the metal framework supporting the ceramic tiles on the St Mary's Church roof. During 2019 we consulted with a specialist



roofing company, metallurgist and an architect to identify the cause of the corrosion and what would be the best solution.

Unfortunately, it was revealed that the metal framework was a faulty product which was not covered by any warranty. We have had comprehensive legal advice on this matter.

At this time we considered alternative roofing such as slate and colourbond steel but these were considered too expensive and not suitable..

The Company that installed the roof in 2005 had been sold and the new owners have offered to replace the faulty metal framework at cost with a superior product which we have had tested by a metallurgist.

The Parish Finance Committee met on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> October, and discussed and agreed that we would accept the best quotes for the repair of the roof, which includes scaffolding, labour and replacement tiles where needed. Undamaged existing tiles will be reused. The costing details are as follows:

- Nulok Roofing System materials \$39,360 ( at Cost Price )
- Transport from the factory in SA \$2,600
- Additional ceramic tiles as required \$5,555.20 + GST
- New valleys and flashings \$2,600 + GST
- Scaffolding \$17,860 + GST
- Labour costs in carrying out 8 week roofing replacement \$106,760 + GST (Other comparison Quote \$121,760)

TOTAL cost to repair Church Roofing System \$174,735.20 + GST

As this work is being done the ridge capping over the sanctuary will be sealed and we are awaiting a quote for this.

Works are to commence Monday 11th January 2021 and we are currently seeking Diocesan Approval. The Parish will be seeking a drawn down loan of \$200,000, as required, from the Diocesan Catholic Development Fund.

These works have also been discussed at our Parish Pastoral Council Meeting on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> October 2020.

# SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

The feast of All Saints celebrates the true life in Christ that we are all called to live.

The **First Reading** is a vision of the heavenly realm. It reminds us of the community of Saints who have gone before us, those inspirational people who embodied their love of Christ through their words and deeds.

The **Psalm** celebrates a vision of the world vibrant with the reality of God's presence in creation and his people. We are blessed when we are able to see the Lord throughout the whole of creation.

# **Financial Report for the financial year 2020**

It has certainly been a unique year and we thank you more than ever for your continuing support in these difficult times.

We also thank our Parish team, who kept us connected despite the constraints imposed by Covid-19. They successfully implemented the streaming of services and digitalised our Parish Bulletin, kept costs to a minimum whilst following health guidelines and applied successfully to government support.

Our main source of income is your generosity through the weekly collections and your embrace of electronic payment alternatives

- 1st collection support of the Priests of the Diocese, our Bishop and retired and sick priests
- 2nd collection running costs of the Parish including staff wages, regular maintenance, utilities, insurance and Pastoral Programs
- Income is mostly from the second collection, which has decreased 7% this financial year. Income also includes some generous donations, the rent from our Freshwater property and government support this year in the form of JobKeeper and the cashflow boost scheme.
- Operational expenses have been carefully managed with a decrease of 7% over prior year.
- Capital expenditure in FY 2020 relates mainly to refurbishment and compliance works at the Manly presbytery as well as expenses relating to the Manly Church roof case.
- Capital expenditure in the current financial year (to June '21) is expected to total \$260,000. This includes \$200,000 to repair the Manly Church roof (see details on front page of the Bulletin), \$30,000 for completion of internal repairs and restoration at the Manly Presbytery, \$20,000 for painting at Freshwater Church and \$10,000 on general maintenance.

## **Bishop Anthony's Message** 27 October 2020

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Tomorrow, Wednesday 28 October, marks the centenary of the birth of Bishop Patrick Murphy, the First Bishop of Broken Bay.

Bishop Murphy was born at Eastwood. He attended St Kevin's Catholic Primary School for his early education, completing his schooling at St Patrick's Christian Brothers College, Strathfield. After high school, he worked for six months in the Commonwealth Bank.

Patrick Murphy undertook studies at St Columba's Seminary Springwood from 1937 to 1940 and then at St Patrick's College, Manly, from 1941 to 1944. He was ordained a priest on 22 July 1944 in St Mary's Cathedral Sydney. On 20 December 1976, after 32 years of priestly ministry, academic studies, and teaching, he was named a bishop by Pope Paul VI and consecrated on 22 January 1977. Bishop Murphy was appointed as an Auxiliary Bishop to the Archbishop of Sydney, Cardinal James Freeman. On 8 April 1986, Pope John Paul II nominated him as the Bishop of the newly established Diocese of Broken Bay. He was installed on 28 May 1986.

It has been said that during his episcopate, Bishop Murphy maintained a style of hard-work, lean administration, and firm leadership, right through to his retirement on 9 July 1996. He lived quietly until his death at the age of 86 on 18 March 2007.

I commend Bishop Murphy to your prayers, as we give thanks to God for his life and ministry as priest and bishop.

Over the past year since my installation as the Fourth Bishop of Broken Bay I have written a short message to you each week in BBNeighbourhoods. I have found it to be a very useful way to keep in touch, especially during the periods of restricted movement and physical distancing.

I am grateful for the numerous people throughout the diocese who have either spoken to me personally or written to me expressing their gratitude for these short messages, which communicate something of the vox Episcopi, "the voice of the bishop".

Beginning in November, I have decided that I will invite different members of our community of the Church around Broken Bay to join me in BBNeighbourhoods. I hope that it will be one way to give expression to the vox Populi, "the voice of the people". This will occur on alternate weeks to my message.

It is not meant to be a political manifesto, nor a sermon, or a homily on the Sunday Scripture readings. What I am hoping to do is highlight the unique and Spirit-filled perspective in our community as you live out your baptismal vocation as a young / senior / married / single / religious / priestly / diaconal / professional I am confident that by listening person. respectfully to the voices from around our community, we might also listen and discern what the Spirit is saying to us as the community of the Church of Broken Bay.

Please join with me in praying that the Holy Spirit will move the hearts, minds, and lives of all people in our community. Pray also for spiritual insight based on your life and relationship with God. I trust that your unique experience and perspective will speak to others and contribute to the shared wisdom in our Church community and beyond.

A reading from the book of the Apocalypse
