# Ascension of the Lord – 21st May 2023 WORLD YOUTH DAY



### **Gospel Reflection**

Today's Liturgy of the Word includes two accounts of Jesus' return to the Father:

Reading 1 is the beginning of the Acts of the "Gospel Apostles, Luke's of the Spirit." Jesus' Ascension begins volume 2 of Luke's work. The words and images here invoke the First Covenant accounts of the ascension of Elijah (2 Kings 2) and the forty years of the Exodus: Luke considers the time that the Risen Lord spent with his disciples a sacred time, a "desert experience" for the apostles to prepare them for their new ministry preaching Gospel the Resurrection. (Acts alone places the Ascension forty days after Easter; the synoptic Gospels including, strangely, Luke's - specifically place the Ascension on the day of Easter; John writes of the "ascension" not as an event but as a new existence with the Father.) Responding to their question about the restoration of Israel, Jesus discourages his disciples from guessing what cannot be known. Greater things await them as his "witnesses." In the missionary work before them, Christ will be with them in the presence of the promised Spirit.

Matthew's Gospel begins with the promise of Emmanuel – "God is with us." It concludes on the Mount of the Ascension, with Emmanuel's promise, "I am with you always."

### Important message from Archbishop Anthony Fischer

I am writing to ask for your assistance in petitioning the ACT Government to reverse a decision to take the ownership and management of Calvary Hospital away from Calvary Health Care – a Catholic operator and give the ownership to the government-run, non-faith-based Canberra Health Services instead.

Calvary Health Care operates hospitals and aged care facilities across the country and has been operating Calvary Hospital for 44 years. It is trusted to provide quality health care to Canberrans regardless of their religious belief.

The ACT Government is trying to ram through a bill that would allow this extreme land-and-assets grab to occur as soon as 3 July 2023. The bill was prepared in secret, with Calvary management and staff only finding out about it the day before it was tabled in parliament, and the government has scrapped the usual inquiry process so that the bill could be law as soon as 31 May 2023.

There is no time to lose: we must act now.

It's no secret that the ACT Government wants to force Calvary Hospital to provide abortions now, and euthanasia and assisted suicide in the future. Taking the land, buildings and hospital equipment and transferring staff employment across to Canberra Health Services allows them to push their anti-life agenda right through the hospital.

This isn't just about Calvary Hospital. If the ACT Government can do this to a Catholic hospital, what is to stop them from doing it to a Catholic school or aged care facility or welfare agency? What's to stop the same thing happening to institutions run by other faith groups as well?

It's also not just an issue for the ACT. If the ACT Government is successful in this radical action, it could serve as a blueprint for other governments as well.

I'm asking for your help in stopping this nonsensical and anti-faith action.

On Thursday, 25 May from 6.30pm to 9.00pm, the Diocese will host a Meet and Greet for our Conference Partners and you are most welcome to join us.




### Mary Help of Christians, Patroness of Australia

Dear Fathers, Deacons, my sisters and brothers of the Diocese of Broken Bay,

We now reach a new phase of our journey. I am inviting all the people of God in the Diocese of Broken Bay to join the conversation.

The Diocesan-wide consultation will begin with Mass as we celebrate our Patronal feast, Mary Star of the Sea.

I encourage you to join me at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral for Vigil Mass at 5.30pm on Tuesday, 30 May 2023 before we move to The Light of Christ Centre for a light supper and conversation as we continue our Cathedral Precinct journey together. A formal invitation will be sent out in the coming days and will detail further how clergy and parishioners are able to confirm their attendance.

I ask that you pray for this journey as it continues to unfold and for which I am sure, will be the source of many new blessings for our Diocese.

### Ascension of the Lord – Year A

### First Reading

Acts 1:1-11 (JB)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew
