Dear Friends,

Bishop Anthony has announced some new Parish Appointments and I am very happy to advise that Fr John Puliparambil is our new Assistant Priest and he will commence on Monday 7th December. Fr John was previously the Assistant Priest for 3 years at Chatswood.

Fr John visited the parish today and he is looking for to moving in. He is a Diocesan Priest from Kerala in India and he has had extensive parish and other pastoral experiences. We look forward to welcoming him into our Parish Community. You will be able to meet Fr John at our Parish Feast Day Mass on the 8th of December 6pm at St Mary's Manly with Bishop Anthony.

Christmas Masses – I have given a considerable thought about how we should plan for our Christmas Masses given the Covid 19 restrictions. On page 3 of this bulletin you will see the proposed Mass times for Manly and Freshwater. We have changed Mass times and added extra Masses so as to accommodate as many people as possible. Once you have decided the Mass you and your family wish to attend **you must book straight away** as numbers are limited. Please see page 3 for more details.

Church Roof – On Wednesday I submitted the formal request to the Diocese to carry out the repair work on the Manly Church Roof which includes the financial expenditure. We have also authorised the initial payment of \$27,464.00 for the supply of the metal framework to be used in the repairing of the roof. We still intend on commencing the works on Monday 11th 2021.

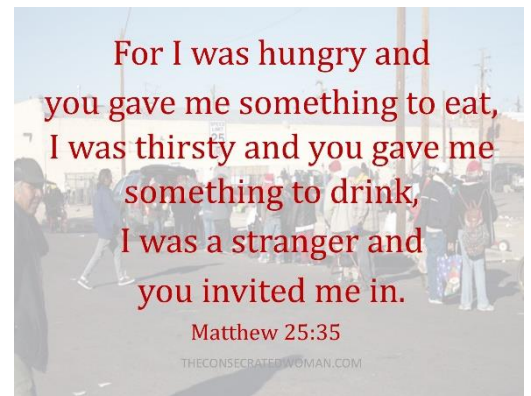

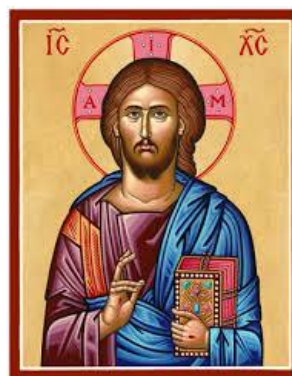


Act of Spiritual Communion

Though we may have felt – and perhaps still feel – 'scattered, during the mist and darkness' of 2020, God keeps the flock always in view (**First Reading**) and will show us where to rest.

We are not abandoned. Rather, the care of the one, true, kingly shepherd means we really shall want for nothing (**Psalms**).

God 'is all in all' (**Second Reading**), so Christ is, indeed, king over the whole universe.

The call of this Shepherd King is heard in the **Gospel**, inviting us to a share, both in his service of others, and in his very life.

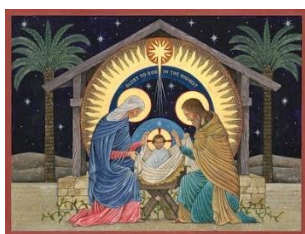
This week, let's try to be open to that call and respond with joyful and generous hearts.

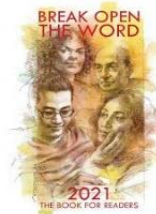

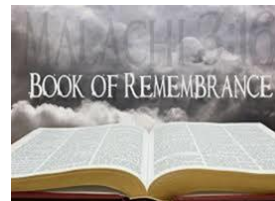

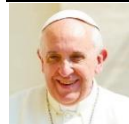

CHRIST THE KING

First Reading *Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17*

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

You, my flock, I judge between sheep and sheep.

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest - it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them. As for you, my sheep, the Lord says this: I will judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and he-goats.

Second Reading *1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28*

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

He will hand over the kingdom to God the Father, so that God may be all in all.

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in the proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death. And when everything is

subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

Gospel *Matthew 25:31-46 (JB)*

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

He will take his seat on his throne of glory, and he will separate men one from another.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'

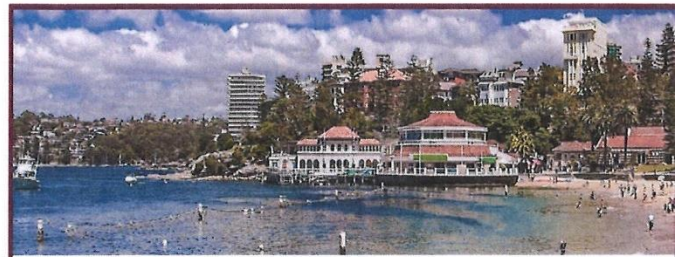
