#### WORLD YOUTH DAY UPDATE ...

Dear all, by the time you receive this report, our time in Portugal will have ended and we will be on our way home. Know that your prayers have greatly supported us in our journey, which has been very physically and spiritually (and sometimes emotionally!) challenging.

This has not been an easy pilgrimage, neither in the lead up to it, nor in its execution. There are few things in life which are easy, but it is usually the harder things which are all the more rewarding. This falls into the latter camp.



This report covers our time with the Pope in the Vigil Mass and Closing Mass, which we spent overnight at the Campo Graca in north Lisbon. Both of these were very moving experiences. As we were very close to the stage, we had a clear view of the Pope at both of these events. To be able to both see and hear the Pope was definitely a highlight of the trip. His chief message was 'Rise Up, Do Not Be Afraid' and for us to say 'Yes' to Jesus as Mary did to the Archangel Gabriel.



As of the 8th of August, we are staving in Fatima, a few hours north of Lisbon, where, in 1917, the Virgin Mary appeared to three peasant children. We have just completed the Rosary in the main square, Shrine along with many other thousands of pilgrims and participated in the Candlelit Procession as well. The flags of many nations were held high Our for Ladv and Richard Heasman was

able hold the Australian and Diocesan flag for our parish and all our diocese and nation. This was indeed a very special moment for us.

We have not yet finished our pilgrimage as there are still many sites to see around Fatima. But with the end drawing near, we reflect on the blessing of representing the Parish at this World Youth Day 2023 and look forward to sharing what we have learned upon our arrival back home.

Matthew 14:22-33 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Command me to come to you over the water.

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side while he would send the crowds away. After sending the crowds away he went up into the hills by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a headwind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord', he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.'
