Pentecost Sunday 9th June 2019



Today marks the climax of the great Fifty Days of Eastertide. Christians celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, and with it, the birth of the Church, the Body of Christ here on earth.

The Feast of Pentecost celebrates many important events in religious history. It was at Pentecost that Moses received the ten commandments from God at Mount Sinai.

King David was born on the feast of Pentecost (from whom it was promised the Messiah would come from his line) and it was festival time in Jerusalem;-fifty days after the feast of Passover and the celebration of the second harvest of the season, the gift of wheat. That is why so many people were in Jerusalem at the time when God sends his divine wind or gust; The Holy Spirit.

The whole history of the Old Testament is presented as fulfilled in this event. God, when he appeared to the Israelites usually appeared in fire. (Moses and the burning bush, fire on Mount Sinai, the pillar of fire that lead the Israelites out of Egypt.) Now as God sends his Spirit, it is not one fire ball but many tongues of fire representing that God's Spirit has been given to all who believe and they are empowered to go out and spread the good news of Jesus to all the world.

The story of the Tower of Babel where the Israelites turned from God and wanted to become their own master and were hindered by the endowment of languages so that they were no longer a united people. Now at Pentecost, God's Holy Spirit gathers all men from around the world to hear Peter and the apostles and unites them as the Spirit grants them the gift of speech so that everyone present may understand God's message of salvation.

Jesus promised his disciples at the Last Supper that both he and the Father will love those who love them and their ways: together they will make their home with us. Jesus also promises his followers the Holy Spirit, the 'Advocate', who will teach them everything and will be their comforter forever.

Through God's Holy Spirit, we are reconciled to each other and then together we work and pray for the common good. The world is renewed; the community is revitalised; as we come to know the all-encompassing peace and love of Christ.

First Reading

Acts 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God.

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.


A reading from the holy Gospel according to John


