THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

Holy Intercessions: Uniting Earth, Purgatory and Heaven

Have you ever noticed all the plaques?

The plaques. Around our church. I'm sure you've seen 'em.

On the sanctuary, the organ, the chapel, adorning the walls. They're everywhere. Seriously, take a look. If you go up close, you'll see they each remember a *special* person who has served or given generously to our church over the years. How good.



Still, why the plaques, you might ask...

...Well, there are several reasons, but traditionally plaques help us to *remember* the person – to remember to pray for them; yes, for their generosity, but importantly, for their soul.

It's the same reason we pray for our past loved ones during the Eucharistic Prayer – we want to bring them as quickly as possible into Heaven. So then, turning to the Mass, this week, let's ask the question: along with the dead, who else do we pray for during the Eucharistic Prayer – Intercessions?

+ + +

Firstly, the Church on Earth – From the beginning, the Church has always prayed for her members living. In the Patristic era, deacons would read out names in Mass from the *diptychs*; two wooden boards hinged together and wax covered so that names could be etched (and erased) with a stylus. Given their importance, the names of the Pope and the local bishop were always included on one of the *diptychs*, and even today it is a serious obligation to pray for them during the Eucharistic Prayer. So too today we pray for *all* of us, the living faithful, to be *one* as the Body of Christ.

Secondly, the Church in Purgatory – Having finished praying for members living, the deacons then turned to the second diptych, to read out the names of the dead. A prayer from the ancient Mass gives us a taste: "We pray You, too, for all the dead who have fallen asleep, whom we call to mind [recalling the names]: sanctify these souls, for You know them all... Number them with Your holy Powers, give them a place and a dwelling in Your Kingdom." What a prayer! And how good is it for us today to pray for the dead, most especially our loved ones who may be in Purgatory – that their purification may be hastened and be brought to Heaven with God forever.

Thirdly, the Church in Heaven – Lastly we pray with Mother Mary, the Apostles, Martyrs and Saints – obviously not for them, because they are already in Heaven; but instead with them, seeking their help. Calling upon the saints is one of the most efficacious ways by which our prayers are answered. As the Catechism states, "They were 'put in charge of many things'. Their intercession is their most exalted service to God's plan. We can and should ask them to intercede for us and the whole world." Never forget to call upon the saints!

+ + +

So then, what shall we do this Mass?

Well, **before Mass, just think of one person** for each of the states of Church above; namely: 1) a living bishop or priest or consecrated or lay person; 2) a deceased loved one; and 3) a saint whose intercession you seek.

Then, at the Eucharistic Prayer, offer the Mass up with and for them. Truly it's the most powerful way to help our brothers and sisters grow closer to Christ and get to Heaven. And in terms of its power to answer our prayers: nothing compares to the Mass.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY Children's Liturgy will be held on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month during the 10:30am Mass.



Second Sunday of Advent- Year C

First Reading Baruch 5:1-9 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Baruch

Jerusalem - God will show you splendour.

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'. Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them. Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

I am quite certain that the One who began this good work in you will see that it is finished when the Day of Christ Jesus comes. God knows how much I miss you all, loving you as Christ Jesus loves you. My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare you for the Day of Christ, when you will reach the perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

Gospel Luke 3:1- 6 (JB)

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke

All people shall see the salvation of God.

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

The Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.



Gospel Reflection

So important is the emergence of John the Baptiser in human history that Luke dates his appearance in six different ways. In his Gospel, Luke introduces John as prophets were introduced in the First Testament ("the word of God was spoken to John son of Zechariah in the desert"). As does Matthew and Mark, Luke cites the famous passage from Isaiah regarding "a herald's voice in the desert" to describe the Baptizer's mission – but Luke quotes more of the Isaiah prophecy than his synoptic counterparts, including the promise of universal salvation that is so central to Luke's Gospel.

Forms of "baptism" were common in the Judaism of Gospel times: in some Jewish communities, it was through baptism rather than circumcision that a Gentile became a Jew. But John's baptism was distinctive. His baptism at the Jordan was a rite of repentance and *metanoia* – a conversion of heart and spirit. The Baptizer's ministry fulfilled the promise of Ezekiel (Ezekiel 36: 25-26): that, at the dawn of a new age, the God of Israel would purify his people from their sins with clean water and instil in them a new heart and spirit.

In his book Sacred Fire: A Vision for a Deeper Human and Christian Community, theologian Ronald Rolheiser writes about the two baptisms John speaks of in today's Gospel: "John's baptism is only a preparation for Jesus' baptism. What's John's baptism? It is a baptism of repentance, a realization of what we are doing wrong and a clear resolution to correct our bad behavior. What is Jesus' baptism? It is an entry into grace and community in such a way that empowers us internally to do what is impossible for us to do by our willpower alone."
