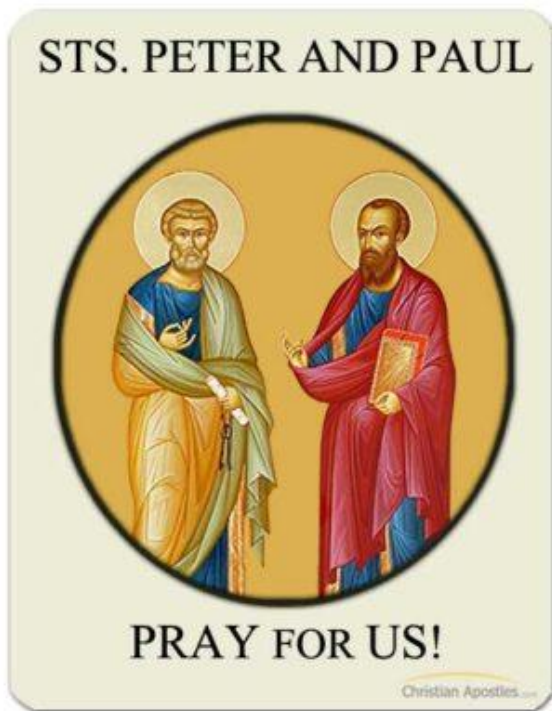

SPIRITUAL CONVERSATIONS GROUP

Do you know someone thinking about becoming Catholic?

A new group is starting up for those who are not baptised, or not fully initiated into the Church, and are **interested in exploring the Catholic faith**. This is *not* a general prayer group or ongoing formation class, but a space specifically for those **discerning entry into the Church**.

The group is informal and begins with conversation, a short reflection from Fr Sam, and time for open questions. It's the first step before the formal RCIA program kicks off in September.

The group meets on **Thursday evenings at 7:00pm** at **St Mary's Parish Office**.

Part 3 - The Vocation to Religious (or Consecrated) Life



We continue our series on vocations this week by reflecting on the vocation to consecrated life. This vocation is a call to a **more radical imitation of Jesus Christ**—a distinctive way of following Him through the profession and living out of the three evangelical counsels: poverty, chastity, and obedience (cf. *Lumen Gentium* 43; *Vita Consecrata* 1).

Poverty is an imitation of Christ's own poverty. Through this vow, consecrated persons bear witness to the truth that God—not the idolatry of money—is the true wealth of the human heart. They renounce personal ownership, embracing a life of simplicity and radical dependence on the providence of God and the support of their community (VC 90).

Chastity for the sake of the Kingdom expresses "a total dedication to God with an undivided heart" (cf. 1 Cor 7:32–34). It serves as a powerful sign that only the infinite God can truly satisfy the human heart, offering a foretaste of the joy and freedom found in divine intimacy (VC 21, 36, 88).

Obedience mirrors Christ's submission to the will of the Father. Far from restricting freedom, the vow of obedience becomes a path to true spiritual freedom. Consecrated persons submit their will to God by practicing obedience to their superiors and community rule, through which God's will is discerned and made manifest (VC 91).

Among other distinguishing features of consecrated life are **community living**, often marked by a distinctive religious garb, common prayer, work, and daily routines. Each form of consecrated life is also united by a **common mission**, grounded in the unique charism of its Institute. These charisms give rise to a variety of forms and expressions. For example, **Religious Life** (monks, nuns, friars, sisters) who may be devoted to prayer and contemplation, missionary work, education, healthcare, and more. **Secular Institutes**: whose members live in the world and often have secular professions, bringing the Gospel into everyday environments. **Societies of Apostolic Life**: who are focused on charitable works and apostolic service, without taking religious vows (though some may profess private ones).

Consecrated life is a **special vocation and a particular gift of the Holy Spirit** (cf. Rom 12:3–8). It is a call to complete self-giving and ongoing conversion, enabling one to live entirely for the Lord (VC 35). For this reason, the Church recognises consecrated life as an "**objectively superior**" vocation, because it mirrors Christ's own way of life—a life entirely consecrated to the Father (VC 32; cf. Mt 22:30).

Consecrated life is also an **eschatological sign**—a visible witness to the future Kingdom of God. It foreshadows the resurrected life and points to the ultimate destiny of the Church in glory (VC 26; cf. Heb 13:14; Phil 3:20).

Let us pray that men and women will courageously discern whether God is calling them to this radical form of discipleship. May Mary, ever-virgin, poor and humble handmaid of the Lord, intercede for us. Amen.

How many of us have family
and friends whose homes
and livelihoods have just
been devastated by the

recent major floods? How many of us not only know the names of the affected areas but have visited with family on properties now under water or spent holidays exploring the treasures of the Manning and Hunter Valleys, or towns like Kempsey, Bulahdelah, Raymond Terrace, Wauchope, Telegraph Point, to name but a few devastated places? We've seen "before flood" with our own eyes and now we see the "after" images on newsfeeds or social media. It's horrific.

The needs of these affected people are great - from basics like temporary shelter, food and clean water, clothing, bedding and household electricals and furniture to emergency fodder, replacement cattle and farm equipment, veterinary support to long term housing. The list goes on. Any and all money can help be effectively applied to mitigate and help recovery. The Saint Vincent de Paul Society is there on the ground listening to people's stories and giving aid.

The M1 now largely bypasses these devoted areas, barely giving us a glimpse of the destruction. But let's dig deep to show all affected Mid North Coast people that our hearts see and hear them. We are taking that turnoff that points to their need. We are with you, Mid North Coast.

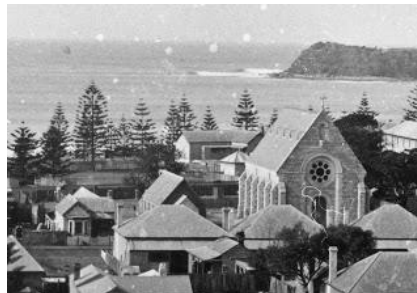

First Reading

Acts 12:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Now I know it is indeed true: the Lord has saved me from the power of Herod.

King Herod started persecuting certain members of the Church. He beheaded James the brother of John, and when he saw that this pleased the Jews he decided to arrest Peter as well. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread, and he put Peter in prison, assigning four squads of four soldiers each to guard him in turns. Herod meant to try Peter in public after the end of Passover week. All the time Peter was under guard the Church prayed to God for him unremittingly.

On the night before Herod was to try him, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, fastened with double chains, while guards kept watch at the main entrance to the prison. Then suddenly the angel of the Lord stood there, and the cell was filled with light. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him. 'Get up!' he said 'Hurry!' - and the chains fell from his hands. The angel then said, 'Put on your belt and sandals.' After he had done this, the angel next said, 'Wrap your cloak round you and follow me.' Peter followed him, but had no idea that what the angel did was all happening in reality; he thought he was seeing a vision. They passed through two guard posts one after the other, and reached the iron gate leading to the city. This opened of its own accord; they went through it and had walked the whole length of one street when suddenly the angel left him. It was only then that Peter came to himself. 'Now I know it is all true,' he said. 'The Lord really did send his angel and has saved me from Herod and from all that the Jewish people were so certain would happen to me.'

I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing.

The Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.
