The baptism of Jesus is an important event in each of the gospels, heralding as it does the beginning of Jesus' public life and marking him out as the beloved of God. Luke's account of the baptism does not focus on the event itself but on its aftermath, i.e. the descent of the Holy Spirit on Jesus while he was at prayer. In describing it in this way, the evangelist is highlighting two themes that are central to his gospel.

These are the role of the Spirit and the importance of prayer in Jesus' life. For Luke the fact that they are important in the life of Jesus means that they must also be important in the lives of his followers.

The adult Jesus now begins his journey to Jerusalem. The Good News as spoken by the angels has not been forgotten, while the most wondrous part of Jesus' story remains as yet to unfold. Today the same Spirit that anointed Jesus for his mission empowers every one of us, baptized in his Spirit, to continue His mission.

Baptism means we are a new creation. We are in a new relationship with God. After Jesus is baptized, the heavens open and God the Father says to him: "You are my beloved son, with you I am well pleased."

Those words are addressed to all those who have been baptized. "You are my beloved son... You are my beloved daughter." He is really present within our hearts in a new way. We have a new power to live in love. We have a new power to be the presence of Christ in the world.

Baptism makes us a new creation. We are given a new life, and that changes everything. We are given a new relationship with God that gives new meaning to every moment of our lives.

Our mission in this new year, 2019, in effect, to continue Jesus' own God-given mission: to seek and find the lost; to call back the "strays"; to attend to the sick and the hurting; to rebuild relationships, families and nations; and in time, to bring God's peace and justice to all people everywhere.

- Many Catechists start as a classroom helper and from there are eager to take on a class themselves.


If you put your hand up to be involved you will be really well supported with training and resources.

Church Renovations

We are very happy to advise that the renovations on the stonework at the eastern end



of the Church have been successfully completed and most of the stain glass windows have been repaired. The total cost of this work was \$254,477.60 and the Parish Finance Committee is very grateful for your donations of \$37,675.00 towards these very large expenditures. It is the Maintenance Committees plan to continue with restoration work on the southern gable and the cleaning of stone in 2019.

It has been 13 years since the roof on the Church was replaced and it now necessary for a full inspection of the roof to be carried out as corrosion of the metal frame work supporting the tiles has been discovered in the north east corner of the roof. You will be advised of the outcome of this inspection when it has been completed.





THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD - YEAR C

First Reading Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it.

'Console my people, console them,' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for. that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

R. Oh, bless the Lord, my soul!

Lord God, how great you are, clothed in majesty and glory, wrapped in light as in a robe! You stretch our the heavens like a tent. R.

All of these look to you to give them their food in due season. You give it, they gather it up: you open your hand, they have their fill. R.

You take back your spirit, they die, returning to the dust from which they came. You send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the earth. R.

Second Reading Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7

A reading from the letter of St Paul to Titus

He saved us through the water of rebirth and renewal in the Holy Spirit.

God's grace has been revealed, and it has made salvation possible for the whole human race and taught us that what we have to do is to give up everything that does not lead to God, and all our worldly ambitions; we must be self restrained and live good and religious lives here in this present world, while we are waiting in hope for the blessing which will come with the Appearing of the glory of our great God and saviour Christ Jesus. He sacrificed himself for us in order to set us free from all wickedness and to purify a people so that it could be his very own and would have no ambition except to do good.

When the kindness and love of God our saviour for mankind were revealed, it was not because he was concerned with any righteous actions we might have done ourselves; it was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us, by means of the cleansing water of rebirth and by renewing us with the Holy Spirit which he has so generously poured over us through Jesus Christ our saviour. He did this so that we should be justified by his grace, to become heirs looking forward to inheriting eternal life.

Gospel Acclamation cf Luke 3:16

Gospel Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

When Jesus had been baptised and had been praying, the heavens were opened and the Holy Spirit came upon him.

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire.'

Now when all the people had been baptised and while Jesus after his own baptism was at prayer, heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily shape, like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you.'


