Gospel Reflection

In this Sunday's Gospel, as in last Sunday's, the Jewish leaders seek to trip Jesus up. The question the lawyer poses was much discussed in rabbinical circles: Which is the greatest commandment? The Pharisees' intention in posing the question was to force Jesus into a single rabbinical school, thereby opening him up to criticism from all other sides. Jesus' answer, however, proves his fidelity to both the Jewish tradition and to a spirituality that transcends the legal interpretations of the commandments: the "second" commandment is the manifestation of the first. If we love the Lord God with our whole being, that love will manifest itself in our feeding of the hungry, our sheltering of the homeless and our liberating the oppressed. connectionsmediaworks.com

entrances. If you prefer to use cash there will be **ONE** collection during Mass at the offertory at Manly and **TWO** at Freshwater.


There is only one collection at Mass at St Mary's Manly which is allocated as follows:



Manly Freshwater Parish Annual Financial **Reporting 2022/2023**

Dear fellow parishioners,

As we endeavour to keep you all well informed each year as to our income/expenditure Church to our income/expenditure position, on behalf of the parish finance committee I hope you find this annual

update informative as we try to keep our finances well managed and balanced.

I am pleased to advise that indeed we have achieved our goals once again of keeping our heads above water while at the same time meeting the many financial commitments in running this vibrant parish and its many activities, as well as our Diocesan commitments.

You do not have to look too far around to see that we have all inherited this magnificent sandstone church building. It is now 150 years old and going strong thanks to our ongoing carefully planned maintenance program that spreads the cost of upkeep over a number of years.

The wonderful pipe organ also requires ongoing maintenance, the cost of which is being greatly assisted by some very generous families within the parish.

The Manly presbytery is a heritage listed building that requires constant attention as you can imagine.

Another of our assets is the Freshwater Church and former presbytery. The latter provides a solid rental income for the parish. The Church has been repainted and maintenance work carried out to the roofing and guttering.

The perimeter fencing surrounding the Manly carpark requires constant painting to control salt air rusting issues and our beloved (huge) fig tree, which is an icon of Manly and cannot be removed, has to be managed.

These are but a few of the many projects that we have to manage on your behalf each year to keep the parish functional and safe for everyone who enjoys all the facilities we happily provide.

Here are some bullet points of interest.....

- Parish population 2000 regulars on and off.
- At Easter and Christmas, the Mass attendances swell to over 4,000 on those feasts.
- Persons coming on and off the property each week include school activities, groups etc 5,000 movements approx.
- Plus, special occasions, sacraments, weddings, funerals and community events.

This is a very busy precinct as you can see, and we appreciate all your weekly contributions which go towards making this all possible and to be enjoyed by many parishioners and our wider community. This helps fulfil our Christian "outreach program".

Your individual generosity every week whether by cash, direct debit, credit card or utilising our tap machines goes greatly towards helping us meet our many financial commitments.

Our income for the past 12 months (1/7/2022 to 30/6/2023) totalled \$414,479.

The main components were your giving (\$290,715), gross rental of \$82,991, and church hire.

Our expenditure over the same period totalled \$342,988.

The main items were office expenses, employment, insurances and regular maintenance and cleaning.

We ended the financial year with a solid operating surplus of \$71,491.

Our budgeted income for the next 12 months is \$441,400

We are budgeting expenditure on normal operations of \$376,284

Hoping for an operating surplus of around \$65,000 in the 12 months to June 2024.

We must keep in mind that we are facing some large capital costs over the next 3 years that include.......

- 1. Presbytery mortar repining and verandah restoration \$125,000
- 2. Replacing sandstone blocks at Whistler Street end of church \$200,000
- 3. Repainting of interior of Manly church \$50,000

Thank you!!! We must thank the financial astuteness of our parish priest Fr David Taylor, who is very mindful of using your generous commitments towards the running of this parish wisely, for this result.

As Fr David frequently advises the finance committee "that he never takes the commitment of our parishioners lightly and appreciates every dollar that comes in". Just for your further assurances, the parish has enjoyed for many years the collective wisdom of the members of our financial team who originate from many and varied commercial backgrounds as they bring their individual experiences and knowledge that greatly assists the proper management of parish finances.

Members are - John Zemek (chair), Fr David Taylor, Micheal McGrath, Anne-Catherine Holland, Ian Press, Valerie Buono and Paul Pervan. It is reassuring that the continued careful management of our parish finances are in the capable hands of such professionals who have your best interests at heart with all their financial decisions on behalf of the parish. Please do not hesitate to approach any of these wonderful volunteer persons should you wish to understand our parish finances in any more detail.



Above all, please keep up your weekly giving and if possible, make weekly/monthly commitment. Please consider a change to direct debit contribution which will help assure the parish administration of its income, week in and week out.

A big thank you to each and every one of you in helping keep this parish functional and operational for the enjoyment of the thousands who use these facilities week by week.

First Reading Exodus 22:20-26 (JB)

A reading from the book of Exodus

If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan, my anger will rage against you.

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans.

"If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him.

"If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."

that the word of the Lord started to spread - and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.
