

The Transfiguration of the Lord – 6th August 2023




Gospel Reflection

Today's Solemnity of the Transfiguration celebrates the extraordinary transformation of Jesus witnessed Gospel, Peter, James, and John on (tradition says) Mount Tabor.

Matthew's account (which takes place six days after Jesus' first prediction of his passion and his first instructions on the call to discipleship) is filled with

images from the First Testament: the voice in the cloud which repeats Isaiah's "Servant" proclamation, the appearance of Moses and Elijah, the dazzling white garments of Jesus.

Matthew's primary interest is the disciple's reaction to the event: their awe at this spectacular vision will soon wither into fear at the deeper meaning of the transfiguration – a meaning that they do not yet grasp. As the disciples will later understand, the transfiguration is a powerful sign that the events ahead of them in Jerusalem are indeed the Father's will. connectionsmediaworks.com





Robert and Gina Marshall, Tongan Choir and Parish Musicians continuing their great service ensuring live music happens at our Sunday Masses which is appreciated. Organist Pat Brown and Freshwater Choir performing on Sunday at 9.00am Mass and doing a great job.

Fr. John to develop Children's Choirs for those family Masses in coming months.

FINANCES Finance Committee Chair John Zemek reported healthy bank balance. He is now preparing a monthly Income/expenditure report for parishioners to be kept well informed. REMEMBER, if you do not carry CASH please make use of the TAP machines at each door entrance. **Your support of the Parish is essential, and we thank you for your contributions.**

MAINTENANCE a new 3 year projected budget is being prepared and reviewed. Regular annual upkeep of Parish Churches and facilities and activities is around \$ 50,000.

COLLEGES and SCHOOLS Principals were pleased to report of increasing enrolment numbers for 2024. After mid-year holiday break all schools are back to full operation and undertaking useful community and sporting activities. Schools' ART competitions underway.

YOUTH and WYD now being held in Lisbon with 3 of our younger parishioners joining Bishop Anthony and 167 other BB Diocesan attendees. Youth Mass held 3rd Sunday at 6pm followed by Pizza evening.

FILM EVENINGS now being planned to stage 4 films in the Stella College Theatre over coming months. Watch this space.

SYNOD Meeting in ROME Our Parish is well represented by Sandi Cornish. Fr David advised that this would be the most important gathering in ROME since Vatican II way back in mid 1960's. Pope Francis called this SYNOD together as he says "the Church simply has to change". Let's pray and look with great interest which just might come from this Synod.



But the boys enjoyed the Mass thoroughly, along with the rest of the 160 pilgrims from the Broken Bay Diocese. The Body of Christ was distributed from hundreds of volunteers in white umbrellas and seems to have been consecrated from the main altar several hundred metres away.

First Reading *Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14 (JB)*

A reading from the book of Daniel

His raiment was as white as snow.

As I watched: Thrones were set in place and one of great age took his seat. His robe was white as snow, the hair of his head as pure as wool. His throne was a blaze of flames, its wheels were a burning fire. A stream of fire poured out, issuing from his presence. A thousand thousand waited on him, ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. A court was held and the books were opened. I gazed into the visions of the night. A reading from the second letter of St Peter

He was honoured and glorified by God the Father, when the Sublime Glory itself spoke to him and said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour.' We heard this ourselves, spoken from heaven, when we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have confirmation of what was said in prophecies; and you will be right to depend on prophecy and take it as a lamp for lighting a way through the dark until the dawn comes and the morning star rises in your minds.

Gospel *Matthew 17:1-9 (JB)*


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'
