Gospel Reflection

The storv of Canaanite woman was marker for the Christians of predominately Gentile Christian communities. Jesus' healing of the daughter of persistent Canaanite mother became prophetic model for the

relationship between **Jewish** and Gentile Christians. The woman is not only a Gentile but also a descendent of the Canaanites, one of Israel's oldest and most despised enemies. Despite Jesus' rebuff of her (equating Gentiles with "dogs," as Jews referred to anyone who was not a Jew), the woman has the presence of mind to point out that "even dogs are given crumbs and scraps from their masters' tables." She displays both great faith in Jesus (addressing him by the Messianic title of "Son of David") and great love for her daughter (subjecting herself to possible ridicule and recrimination for approaching Jesus) that should inspire both Jew and Gentile – and Christian.


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Woman, you have great faith.


