FIRST READING ISAIAH 50:4-7

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. REFLECTION 10th April 2022 GOSPEL JOHN 8:1-11

Most people love a parade, noisily making the most of a chance to come together with others of like mind, to celebrate an event or highlight an issue. Holy Week begins with a parade. People get really involved throwing down on their garments and rejoicing at all the mighty works they have witnessed through Jesus. Jesus rides triumphant through it all and encourages his followers to praise God with loud voice. Parades can bring out the best, and worst, in people. It is hard not to get caught up in the emotion of the moment and events that were supposed to be happy and peaceful sometimes deteriorate into chaos and violence. How the parade mood changed over the course of Holy Week! In the long Gospel of the Passion we see Jesus no longer triumphant but separated from his followers, insulted, struck, spat upon, and finally carrying his cross to crucifixion on Golgotha: "He emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave ... even to accepting death on a cross? What reaction do I have to today's readings? Has my Lenten journey prepared me to be really present during this Holy Week?



GOSPEL REFLECTION JOHN 13:1-15

Reproduced from God's Word 2022: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

Tonight's readings are about passing over. Each year the Jews celebrated Passover, a day of festival remembering the marking of their houses with blood, the sharing of a meal and God passing over them, leading them to freedom. Paul passes on how Jesus left us a profound way of remembering him through the sharing of bread and wine with the gathered community. John describes how Jesus passed over to us the example of how to love one another as he had loved us—by washing the feet of others. At the time of the Passover Meal, both in Exodus and at the Last Supper, those involved did not know the significance of what was happening but later they remembered and reflected and understood. So, with us. We can read these events as they are written and move on. Or we can embed their significance in our lives as followers of Christ—a significance that sees us standing ready, sharing our lives, and humbly serving others, all because Jesus showed us what loving God really means.

REFLECTION JOHN18:1-19: 42

If we want to pray with the events of Good Friday, today's psalm provides us with just that opportunity, 'Into your hands I commend my spirit ' recalls Jesus' agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, imploring God for help and coming to acceptance of what is to come. I am a reproach' reminds us of the scorn and fear directed at Jesus during the dark of the night as he was taken from one leader to another for judgement. Those who see me ... away from me takes us back to the loneliness that Jesus must have felt when everyone, even his friends, deserted him. But as for me, I trust in you, Lord' prompts us to appreciate that Jesus gave absolutely everything he had, right to his last breath. 'Be strong, let your heart take courage is Jesus' message to those at the foot of the Cross, and to us who share this Good Friday with him two thousand years later. Can we too pray Father, I put my life in your hands?
