
Gospel Reflection Excerpt from: God's Word 2018 Daily Reflections

People afflicted with leprosy and similar skin diseases were regarded as untouchables in the Jewish society of Jesus' day. In keeping with the Law (see today's first reading), they had to proclaim their uncleanness publicly and keep their distance from all but their own kind. Today's gospel story, narrated with an economy of detail, poignantly captures the pariah status of one such unfortunate man. No onlookers are identified; there are only two characters- the leper in need of compassion and Jesus mercifully responsive to his need. In a sense, Jesus takes upon himself the uncleanness of leper; for in touching him he renders himself, according to the Law, ritually impure. In our own day there are classes of people who are bracketed out by society—outcasts judged harshly as inferior beings by law-abiding citizens and condemned to lead lives of conspicuous misery. Even as we stand by them in faith and love, we can make our own the leper's prayer: 'Lord, if you will, you can make me clean'.

Most Rev Peter A Comensoli is calling for the people of Broken Bay to join him in making the pilgrimage of Lenten Stational Masses in Broken Bay.



Ash Wednesday Reflection God's Word 2018 Daily Reflections

Our Lenten fast can benefit both our physical health and, if accompanied by conversion of heart, our spiritual wellbeing as well. It can also serve to remind us that the whole material world is God's gift to us, to be shared and enjoyed by all people. Jesus himself fasted for forty days before he began his public ministry (Mt 4:1-11). In today's gospel reading Jesus links fasting with prayer, almsgiving and the practice of good works unostentatiously performed. This is completely in harmony with the word of God revealed through the prophet Isaiah: 'Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not hide yourself from your own kin?' (Isa 58:6-7)

The theme for this year's World Day of the Sick is provided by the words that Jesus spoke from the Cross to Mary, his Mother, and to John: "Woman, behold your son ... Behold your mother. And from that hour
