Parish Finance update for the year ending 30 June 2022

Total income for the year is steady at \$103,287 (from 101,574 last year). Total Expenses for the year have decreased slightly to \$128,260 (from \$136,923 last year). Whilst this should have left our Parish with an operating shortfall we were fortunate to receive government assistance of \$33,222. With property inspections now due we will have to fund part of this from reserves.

As always, new Parishioners are encouraged to join our planned giving programme. Please contact the Parish office for more information. Don't forget the Broken Bay Parish Giving app allows you to set up regular contributions to our parish first and second collections without the need for physical money (eg notes & coins).

As you know inflationary increases will burden us all and the Parish is not immune. Further increases in utility costs are already coming through. Whilst I encourage you to give more if you can, the answer for our Parish lies in an increase in patronage. Please encourage your families and friends to attend Mass. Our numbers have fallen for a number of reasons however now is the time to welcome people back to our Church.

Thank you for your continued support of our Parish.

Reflection 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reproduced from God's Word 2022: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

Our readings this Sunday are a handbook for learning about God. We read the words which, in the different contexts of the Old and New Testament stories, seem to say the same thing: God is merciful! Our reflection starts with a very well-known story about the people of Israel. Their action in replacing the Covenant of Love with worship of a golden calf shows both human weakness and the endless patience of God. Despite the chosen people disappointing their leader, Moses, by offending God, God is patient and does not bring on them any punishment.

Similarly, what we learn in the responsorial psalm is that God is kind and forgiving. He can purify our hearts and make them his own again.

There is even more reassurance about the extent of God's forgiveness for us, who have been sinners, in the letter of Saint Paul to Timothy. The parables in today's Gospel also highlight the mercy of God who searches for all who are lost until they are found. The focus in this story is not on how they came to be lost but on God who celebrates their return and shows even more clearly that his love is unconditional and endless.

What if the focus of our week to come will be to mirror in some small way God's attitude?

What if, this week, we try to find something good in every person we meet, despite our natural reaction to their wrongdoings?

What if, this week, we try to be a little bit more merciful to ourselves? What if...?

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, 11th September 2022 THE LITURGY OF THE WORD *Reproduced from Liturgia*

FIRST READING EXODUS 32:7-11, 13-14

The Lord spoke to Moses, 'Go down now, because your people whom you brought out of Egypt have apostatised. They have been quick to leave the way I marked out for them; they have made themselves a calf of molten metal and have worshipped it and offered it sacrifice. "Here is your God, Israel," they have cried "who brought you up from the land of Egypt!" The Lord said to Moses, 'I can see how headstrong these people are! Leave me, now, my wrath shall blaze out against them and devour them; of you, however, I will make a great nation.' But Moses pleaded with the Lord his God. 'Lord,' he said, 'why should your wrath blaze out against this people of yours whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with arm outstretched and mighty hand? Remember Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, your servants to whom by your own self you swore and made this promise: I will make your offspring as many as the stars of heaven, and all this land which I promised I will give to your descendants, and it shall be their heritage for ever.' So the Lord relented and did not bring on his people the disaster he had threatened.

SECOND READING 1 TIMOTHY 1:12-17

I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has given me strength, and who judged me faithful enough to call me into his service even though I used to be a blasphemer and did all I could to injure and discredit the faith. Mercy, however, was shown me, because until I became a believer I had been acting in ignorance; and the grace of our Lord filled me with faith and with the love that is in Christ Jesus. Here is a saying that you can rely on and nobody should doubt: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. I myself am the greatest of them; and if mercy has been shown to me, it is because Jesus Christ meant to make me the greatest evidence of his inexhaustible patience for all the other people who would later have to trust in him to come to eternal life. To the eternal King, the undying, invisible and only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

GOSPEL LUKE 15:1-10

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them: 'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say, "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance. 'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.'

Voice of the People Vox Populi 7th September 2022

Everyone has a birthday and for many it is a joyous time.

This week we celebrated the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary on its traditional fixed date of 8 September, nine months after the 8 December celebration of her immaculate conception as the child of Saints Joachim and Anne. The Church has celebrated this day since at least the sixth century.

The circumstances of the Virgin Mary's infancy and early life are not directly recorded in the Bible, but other documents and traditions describing the circumstances of her birth are cited by some of the earliest Christian writers from the first centuries of the Church. We are also told Mary was raised as a child of God, and when the angel Gabriel told Mary that she had been chosen to be the Mother of Jesus, she already had great faith and trust that allowed her to say "yes" to God's plan.

Next week we celebrate another feast day of Our Lady, but can't say this one is joyous. It is 15 September and is Our Lady of Sorrows. This title focuses on the intense suffering and grief during the passion and death of her Son and the seven dolors or sorrows.

In a unique way Mary suffered alongside her Divine Son as he gave His life for us. This devotion is particularly remembered this month.

We also acknowledge this month those children and vulnerable people we have not protected and cared for and who have been harmed by abuse, both directly and indirectly.

This Sunday, 11 September is Safeguarding Sunday, however in the Diocese of Broken Bay we are particularly remembering safeguarding awareness for the entire month, and encouraging families to build meaningful connections with their children and young people around them. 1 September was the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, established by Pope Francis in 2015.
