**REFLECTION 12TH SEPTEMBER Mk 8:27-35** Reproduced from God's Word 2021: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

Walking northwards towards Caesarea Philippi, Jesus asked his disciples a question which continues to resonate through the ages: 'Who do people say I am?' If we are serious in proclaiming our Christian faith, it is a question to which we must provide a sincere personal response not only in a creedal statement but also in the manner of our daily life. Jesus was probably well aware of the negative terms with which his enemies described him. To them he was a blasphemer, a false prophet, a law-breaker, a glutton and drunkard and even a madman. Others saw him more positively as John the Baptist or Elijah. Both to the blind man at Bethsaida (John 9) and to the Samaritan woman at Jacob's Well (John 4), he was a prophet. Jesus answered his own question in a series of seven 'I am' statements in John's Gospel in which he claimed to be the bread of life, the light of the world, the door of the sheepfold, the good shepherd, the resurrection and the life, and the way and the truth and the life. In responding to Jesus' question today and seeking our own true identity, we might also ask Jesus, 'Who do you say I am?'

### Reflection

## Reproduced from God's Word 2021: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

In the eyes of the Roman colonisers and Jesus' Jewish contemporaries, crucifixion was the ultimate degradation that could be imposed on a human being. And yet, the cross that rises above our churches, that we venerate as a community on Good Friday and that we make upon our bodies in liturgical celebrations and sacramental rituals is uncontestably the most potent and universal sign of our Christian faith. In Pope Saint John Paul II's words, it is, the "privileged place" where human misery and divine mercy meet. It was only when he became a witness to the paschal events in Jerusalem that the admirable Nicodemus appreciated the import of Jesus' words about his being 'lifted up'. As Paul wrote to the community in Corinth, 'The language of the cross may be illogical to those who are not on the way to salvation, but those of us who are on the way see it as God's power to save' (1 Corinthians 1: 18).

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

#### Sunday Mass 12th September 2021 THE LITURGY OF THE WORD *Reproduced from Liturgia*

#### First Reading Isaiah 50:5-9

The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed. My vindicator is here at hand. Does anyone start proceedings against me? Then let us go to court together. Who thinks he has a case against me? Let him approach me. The Lord is coming to my help, who dare condemn me?

#### **Responsorial Psalm Ps 114:1-6, 8-9**

#### R. I will walk in the presence of the Lord, in the land of the living.

I love the Lord for he has heard the cry of my appeal; for he turned his ear to me in the day when I called him. R. They surrounded me, the snares of death, with anguish of the tomb; they caught me, sorrow and distress.

I called on the Lord's name. O Lord my God, deliver me! R. How gracious is the Lord, and just; our God has compassion. The Lord protects the simple hearts; I was helpless so he saved me! R.

He has kept my soul from death, my eyes from tears and my feet from stumbling. I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living. R.

#### SECOND READING JAMES 2:14-18

Take the case, my brothers, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that he has faith. Will that faith save him? If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty,' without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead. This is the way to talk to people of that kind: 'You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds - now you prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.'

#### GOSPEL MARK 8:27-35

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said, 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked, 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But, turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.' He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'


