Gospel Reflection

There is a good chance that today many parish communities will sing one of the well-known versions of Psalm 39, 'Here I am Lord', based on the ancient hymn of David. While we may sing this hymn enthusiastically our reality is that we are usually not here in the present. Instead we carry burdens from the past and are troubled with anxiety about the future. Often the one place we struggle to be is where we are and in the reality of the present moment. This does not mean we should forge the pain from the past or ignore our anxiety about the future since emotion (paid, anxiety or other) can only exist in the present. While what has happened in the past has already happened, our present feelings of guilt, grief, hurt or pain about a past experience are an opportunity for us today to experience the healing of God in the present. In the same way anxiety about the future is a present feeling and can be healed by God in the present. The only moment God has with us now is the present reality of the circumstances of this day. Let our prayer from this present reality be simply, 'Jesus: Here I am...

asked the children 'when did your life begin?' A few quickly answered 'when I was born 'and another added when I was very little inside my mummy.' I affirmed their responses but suggested that I was looking for another answer. One sharp child looked especially puzzled for a moment then called out 'when I was baptized.' This is the most accurate answer of all. When I asked my parents to tell me about my own baptism I was surprised by the simplicity of the gathering. My father had arranged it with the priest in the small New Zealand town where we lived and he collected my mother and I from the maternity hospital stopping at the church on our way home. My godparents and grandmother were the only others present. In this initial sacrament of the Church I became a child of God, one on whom God's favour rests. About the time I had the baptism conversation with my parents I discovered the date on which I was baptized in this little church on the south bank of the Waitaki River. Now every year I celebrate the anniversary of this day on which my little existence became a divine life.

This discernment phase is the last opportunity for us as lay members of the Catholic Church to have a definite influence on the agenda for the Plenary Council. From the listening and dialogue phase of 2018/19 responses were grouped into six areas/themes, listed below, to respond to the Ouestion

How is God calling us to be a Christ-centred Church?

- Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal
- Prayerful and Eucharistic
- Humble Healing and Merciful
- A Joyful, Hope-filled and Servant Community
- Open to Conversion, Renewal and Reform
- Missionary and Evangelising

Each week, commencing 18/19 January, one of the above themes will be addressed in our bulletin. Everyone is asked to pray and reflect upon Scripture, church teaching and our contemporary situation in order to discern the answer to the question asked and make suggestions on how we should respond. This discernment will help to shape the agenda for the first session of the Plenary Council in October 2020.
