# SUNDAY MASS 12 JULY 2020 THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

## FIRST READING ISAIAH 55:10-11

Thus says the Lord: 'As the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.'

## **Responsorial Psalm Ps 64:10-14**

R. The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest.

## SECOND READING ROMANS 8:18-23

I think that what we suffer in this life can never be compared to the glory, as yet unrevealed, which is waiting for us. The whole creation is eagerly waiting for God to reveal his sons. It was not for any fault on the part of creation that it was made unable to attain its purpose, it was made so by God; but creation still retains the hope of being freed, like us, from its slavery to decadence, to enjoy the same freedom and glory as the children of God. From the beginning till now the entire creation, as we know, has been groaning in one great act of giving birth; and not only creation, but all of us who possess the first-fruits of the Spirit, we too groan inwardly as we wait for our bodies to be set free.

### **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION**

Alleluia, alleluia! The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower; all who come to him will live for ever. Alleluia!

## GOSPEL MATTHEW 13:1-23

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore. And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying: "A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

The disciples approached him and said, "Why do you speak to them in parables?" He said to them in reply, "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted. To anyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. This is why I speak to them in parables, because they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand. Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says: You shall indeed hear but not understand, you shall indeed look but never see. Gross is the heart of this people, they will hardly hear with their ears, they have closed their eyes, lest they see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their hearts and be converted, and I heal them. "But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it. "Hear then the parable of the sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart.

The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit. But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."

## **REFLECTION FOR 12TH JULY**

Christ invites us in today's Gospel reading to consider two things: God's word given to us, and the state of our hearts and lives to receive this word. Jesus presents these various states as different kinds of 'ground' for the sowing of God's word. Jesus communicates through the 'Parable of the Sower' that we have different capacities to listen, understand and follow God's word. Nonetheless, the Gospel communicates that God's word is intended to 'bear fruit' and give life. The first reading from Isaiah assures us that God's word is purposeful and will always flower in someone's heart. In our prayer time today, we are invited to consider what kind of ground our hearts and lives are for receiving his word. How does God's word 'flower' in my heart? How do I produce the fruits of joy, peace and charity in my life/ Jesus emphasizes to his closest disciples in today's Gospel how blessed are those that hear or see what they have seen and heard. Let us remember we are the blessed. Let us take stock of how we receive the blessing of God's word today!

#### THE ANNUAL SEA SUNDAY APPEAL IS TO BE HELD ON SUNDAY, 12 JULY 2020

On Sea Sunday, the church prays for all those who live and work at sea. This year marks the centenary of the Apostleship of the Sea. In 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted the vulnerability of seafarers working on cruise ships, risking exposure to the virus, prevented from returning home and caught in critical situations of isolation on sea vessels. Stella Maris, Apostleship of the Sea, is the official maritime welfare agency of the Catholic Church that supports seafarers both practically and spiritually, attending to their welfare in many ports around Australia and elsewhere through Stella Maris Centres and Chaplaincies.

Chaplains, volunteers and staff visit to speak to the ship's crew, offer friendship, arrange Mass and attend Mass with them, listen to their needs, and provide access to Wi-Fi or Internet so they can contact their families. Hospitality within Stella Maris Centres is also offered which provides an important break from work routines onboard.
