REFLECTION—15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Themes of creation run through our scriptures today. Isaiah affirms that the word of God is ever fruitful like the rain and the snow watering the earth, Paul maintains that the whole of creation, along with humankind, eagerly awaits the full revelation of God's purpose, and Jesus offers the Parable of the Sower, which explains the various ways in which the Word of God is received. Human gardeners usually ensure seeds are deposited in well prepared soil at well-spaced intervals, in contrast to the extravagant Sower in this parable who broadcasts the seed widely without discriminating.

Parables are intended to make us delve deeper. The most assiduous of gardeners may find their efforts thwarted by weeds, soil conditions and climate change, while the most ardent disciples of Jesus may still listen and not hear, see and not perceive. We, like creation, are often held back from enjoying the full freedom and glory of the children of God by the sinful perversity of human behaviours, systems and structures. Let us always retain the hope that the Word of God will succeed in what it was sent to do by bearing good fruit in our lives.

COMMUNION BLESSING

You can still receive a blessing if you are not Catholic, have not yet received your Sacrament of First Eucharist/Holy Communion, or, if you are Catholic but are not in a state of grace.

To receive a blessing instead of communion during a Catholic Mass, simply approach the priest during the distribution of communion with your arms folded across your chest, and the priest will offer a blessing.

Please remember if you are receiving communion, the consecrated host must enter your mouth to be consumed before returning to your seat.



UNABLE TO STAND IN LINE FOR COMMUNION? USE THE YELLOW BAND!

Please use the yellow bands located at the back of the Church (in a tub underneath the bulletin shelf) to indicate that you cannot stand in line to receive the Eucharist, by slipping it onto the side of the pew where you will be seated.

Our Priest or Eucharistic Minister will see this and will tend to you at the end of Communion.

Gross is the heart of this people,

they will hardly hear with their ears,

they have closed their eyes,

lest they see with their eyes

and hear with their ears

and understand with their hearts and be converted,

and I heal them.

"But blessed are your eyes, because they see,

and your ears, because they hear.

Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people

longed to see what you see but did not see it,

and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

"Hear then the parable of the sower.

The seed sown on the path is the one

who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it,

and the evil one comes and steals away

what was sown in his heart.

The seed sown on rocky ground

is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy.

But he has no root and lasts only for a time.

When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word,

he immediately falls away.

The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word,

but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word

and it bears no fruit.

But the seed sown on rich soil

is the one who hears the word and understands it,

who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."

Letter to the People of God in the Diocese of Broken Bay

As many will know, upon the conclusion of the mandate of Archbishop Anthony as Apostolic Administrator, the College of Consultors elected me on Friday 26 June for the service of Diocesan Administrator during this time of transition and anticipation of our fifth bishop. I thank the College of Consultors for the trust it has placed in me by its election of me to this service, a trust I never presume or take for granted. And I thank everyone for their warm wishes on this development.

I take this opportunity once again to pay tribute to our 4th Bishop, Archbishop Anthony who has left us for his new ministry in the Universal Church. We thank him for his six and a half years of energetic and passionate service as our Shepherd and for the many ways in which he endowed our Diocese with life, strength and possibility. We continue to hold him in our hearts with warm appreciation and pray God's richest blessings upon him. He has now arrived in Rome and is settling into his new office.

As we appreciate, canon law intentionally limits the authority of a Diocesan Administrator, and while ordinary governance continues, major long-term decisions are deferred. This protects the freedom of the incoming Bishop and prevents significant commitments being made during a transitional period. During this interim time, the College of Consultors has an enhanced role in the governance of our Diocese, and I shall work closely with it in the management of the many issues that arise.

It is important for us to recognise, of course, that the life of our Diocese does not cease during the vacancy of the See. It is not possible to know how long our new time of waiting for our 5th bishop might be. In part this will also be informed by the appointment of a new Nuncio, following Archbishop Balvo's recent retirement.

During this time of waiting we are sustained by the presence of the Risen Lord and the continual action of the Holy Spirit. And so, this can be a privileged time of reflection, shared responsibility, prayer, discernment, and preparation for the next chapter in the life of our local Church. The waiting period can also become a spiritual exercise in trust: trust in God's providence; trust in the wisdom of the Church; trust that the Holy Spirit continues to guide us even in uncertainty. Indeed, this echoes many biblical moments when God's people were called to wait before entering a new phase of mission.

Now, as we go forward together, let us join in prayer:



Christ, in whom we are one, you are the Good Shepherd who never abandons your flock. In this time of waiting and anticipation, we place our trust entirely in your providence. We thank you for the gift of our Diocese of Broken Bay stretching from the Northern Beaches, across the North Shore, to the shores of the Central Coast. We are a people shaped by the sea, by community, and by faith. As the waters of our bays and coastline speak of your vastness and your care, so too do we cast ourselves upon your wisdom in this moment of transition.

Guide the hearts and minds of those entrusted with discerning the right shepherd for our Diocese that they may listen deeply to your Holy Spirit and choose wisely for the good of your people.

Stir in us, your people of Broken Bay, a renewed sense of unity and purpose. May this season of waiting not weaken us, but deepen our faith, strengthen our bonds, and renew our commitment to the Gospel.

And we pray for the one you are preparing to lead us as Bishop. Form him in humility and courage. Grant him a shepherd's heart, a teacher's wisdom, and a servant's joy.

We turn to you, Our Lady Star of the Sea, patroness of our Diocese and guiding light for all who navigate uncertain waters. As sailors have long looked to the stars to find their way, so we look to you now to intercede for us, to steady us, and to lead us safely to the one God is sending to guide us.

May Christ, the Head of the Church, be glorified in our waiting, in our welcoming, and in all that is to come. And this we ask through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

PHYSICAL AND SEXUAL ABUSE ARE SERIOUS INDICTABLE OFFENCES UNDER THE NSW CRIMES ACT 1900. It is an offence to fail to report knowledge or belief of a serious indictable offence. If in doubt, call 000.
