REFLECTION—We are usually pretty good at creating and 'us' against 'them' mentality. Think of sports teams, different areas of your town/city, genders, ethics origins, political parties, religions... the list goes on. It can be a wakeup call to recognise when we use 'we' or 'us' in a sentence.

The readings today make a big call for widening that sense of 'we' or recognizing the value in the 'other'. Perhaps we can be proud of our own faith, culture, etc., but also open to learn and appreciate whatever lies outside of them. For Elisha, it was Naaman the commander of the Syrian army. For Paul, it was the Jewish people—'those who are chosen'. And for Jesus and his disciples, it was the Samaritan leper. The best examples of faith are in those we least expect. And, like Paul, we can even suffer for those who are not like us. In reaching across the invisible boundaries between us, we might discover something wonderful. The 'other' may bless our lives in unlikely ways, and we may bless them. Our differences are not so great after all. What reason to celebrate! That is surely a reason to return and give thanks to God.

OCTOBER— THE MONTH OF THE MOST HOLY ROSARY

DID YOU KNOW? Blessed Bartolo is the first satanic priest to become a Saint.

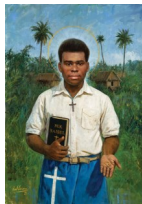
He was once a devout Catholic, but in 19th century Italy He turned his back on the church and became a priest of Satan, fully immersed in the occult. He fell ill and through the prayers of loved ones and the intercession of Our Lady, Bartolo found his way back. He renounced Satan, returned to the Catholic faith and dedicated the rest of his life to spreading the Rosary. He moved to the ruins of Pompeii, a place once buried in ash and sin, now destined to become a city of mercy. There, he re-built not just buildings, but hearts. He founded schools for orphans, cared for the poor and built the great shrine of Our Lady of The Rosary of Pompeii. Saint John Paul II called him 'The Apostle of The Rosary'. Currently the church calls him 'Blessed' but on October 19th 2025 he will be **Saint Bartolo Longo**. He will be the patron saint of those struggling with the occult, satanism and spiritual warfare. A witness that no one is beyond redemption.



Never doubt the power of the Rosary and the Mercy of God.

Also to be canonized on 19 October 2025 is Papua New Guinea's first saint, **Blessed Peter To Rot**, as announced by Pope Leo XIV.

Blessed Peter To Rot was a lay catechist who was martyred in 1945 for continuing his apostolate despite a ban imposed by the Japanese. His case is special for several reasons: he will be the first native Papuan saint, a fervent defender of marriage and the family, a catechist committed to the mission of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart. His sanctity is the fruit of the close collaboration of priests and laity in evangelization.



Bishop Anthony invites everyone is to celebrate the Canonization of St Peter To Rot at Our Lady of the Rosary Cathedral, Waitara. Bishop Anthony will celebrate Mass at 11.00am on Sunday 19 October 2025. Peter To Rot was a shining example of fidelity, courage, and witness.

You can still receive a blessing if you are not Catholic, have not yet received your Sacrament of First Eucharist/Holy Communion, or, if you are Catholic but are not in a state of grace.

To receive a blessing instead of communion during a Catholic Mass, simply approach the priest during the distribution of communion with your arms folded across your chest, and the priest will offer a blessing.

Please remember if you are receiving communion, the consecrated host must enter your mouth to be consumed before returning to your seat.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

A reading from the second book of the Kings

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child.

Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'
