Reflection 14.04.24

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Understanding the Scriptures does not mean opening the Bible and finding specific texts referring to the suffering of the Messiah.

For sure, there is a wealth of scriptural allusions to the suffering of holy people, chief among them the Suffering Servant of God (see the Fourth Song in Isaiah 53). But these remain allusions, not texts explicitly saying that the Messiah would suffer. This explains why no one in Israel expected a suffering Messiah; on the contrary, the Messiah was expected to be a glorious figure who would restore the 'fallen hut' of King David. That Jesus as the Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead is all part of God's plan.

His death on the cross is not a mere coincidence; but an integral part of God's ongoing plan to save his people. Jesus' death is not solely the consequence of human pride and machinations, but the expression of total self-giving love that achieves reconciliation with God.



We warmly welcome the children who are to be baptized this weekend into our Parish Community. May the grace of the Lord Jesus bless them and their families.

RELIC SNIPPETS

Each week information on the relic will be included under the heading 'Relic Snippets.' It is planned all of these regular updates will ensure every parishioner is aware of the progress of the Shrine development, its importance to our Parish, and the continuing strengthening of our catholic faith as we move through the 21st Century.

This week's snippet relates specifically to the planned presentation of the Shrine, its location and the decisions which have already been made. The Shrine will be located on the wall where the Divine Mercy picture hangs. (The Divine Mercy will be placed on an easel stand near the opposite wall). It will consist of three components:

- 1. Artwork, 2. Relic presentation and 3. Picture of St Cecilia's incorrupt body. The relic itself will be placed in a gold monstrance contained within a timber box with carvings similar to those already in our church. The security of the relic is a major item to be addressed. The Security Officer from Wyong Police station will be

providing the advice and installation 'know how'. The Artwork has yet to be finalised but this will endeavor to present a 3rd century Saint in a 21st century setting.

The opening of the Shrine of St Cecilia will occur on **Saturday 23 November**. Father David Ranson, the Vicar general will preside over the opening mass commencing at 11:00 am. A major celebration will be organized for this day and all parishioners are urged to be part of this special day.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

They were still talking about this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem.
