

REFLECTION—3rd Sunday of Advent

John laboured diligently preparing the people to welcome the Messiah who, he believed, was coming as a judge to punish the wicked and reward the good.

However, languishing in his prison cell, John hears of the healing and forgiving ministry of Jesus. He is perplexed and filled with doubt, because Jesus does not conform to his expectations. So, John sends his disciples to ask Jesus if he is the long-awaited Messiah. Jesus

answers simply: Go and tell John what you see and hear. Clearly in Jesus' ministry the prophecies of Isaiah (29:18-19; 35:5-6; 61:1) are being realised and the kingdom of God is being inaugurated. And so, Jesus declares blessed those who can see the connection between his ministry and the kingdom of God. These are the ones who keep faith in him.

Although Jesus holds John in the highest regard, as the greatest born of women, he nevertheless adds rather surprisingly: yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is. Who are the least? They are those who have had the privilege of knowing and accepting Jesus as their Saviour. Today, we, the disciples of Jesus, are blessed to be the least in the kingdom.

DID YOU KNOW?

Why is Mass called Mass?

"Missa," meaning "Ite, missa est" or "Go, you are sent," signifying the mission of believers and reflecting the Mass's purpose to send the faithful out to spread the Good News and live as Jesus did. The Mass is rooted in the Last Supper, a re-enactment of Christ's sacrifice and a memorial of his death and resurrection.


CHILDREN'S LITURGY—YOU'RE INVITED!

You can still receive a blessing if you are not Catholic, have not yet received your Sacrament of First Eucharist/Holy Communion, or, if you are Catholic but are not in a state of grace.

To receive a blessing instead of communion during a Catholic Mass, simply approach the priest during the distribution of communion with your arms folded across your chest, and the priest will offer a blessing.

Please remember if you are receiving communion, the consecrated host must enter your mouth to be consumed before returning to your seat.

I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'
