

REFLECTION 14TH NOVEMBER Mk 13:24-32

Reproduced from God's Word 2021: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

Hope is a powerful motivating force for life, and both the first reading and the Gospel offer hope. In Daniel's day, the people were being persecuted and put to death for their beliefs. In Mark's time, those who chose Jesus were also being driven from the temple, persecuted and killed. Both readings offer hope to the people and to all who presently choose to follow God. Persecution of Christians continues, and we know that life can be tough: illness, violence, loneliness, etc. Wherein lives hope for us? Well, from Daniel, 'your own people (those whose names are recorded in the Book) will be spared', and from Mark: 'my words will not pass away', and that he, the Son of Man 'will send his angels to gather his chosen'. And even though there are frequent prophecies about the ending of all we know, Jesus says that 'nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; only the Father'. Hope reminds us that by being attentive to the signs of the times, we will recognise that 'he is near'- in the changing seasons, in the presence of those we love and in the wonder of all of creation.

IMPORTANT

It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.

From Monday 8 November until 15 December, or NSW reaches a 95% double vaccination rate, the following will apply:

- Density limits for places of worship will be 1 person per 2 square meters.
- Electronic sign-in is mandatory by one of the following methods:
- o An individual using their device to check in with the venue's **QR Code**
- o Welcomers assist those without their own device by checking them in via the **Service NSW** webform . This webform allows for:
- + manual sign-in by typing in the individual's details or
- + scanning their COVID check-in card.
- Singing and dancing by unvaccinated congregants is not allowed in indoor areas. Although singing and dancing by vaccinated congregants are now allowed, we will continue to discourage congregational singing until the whole congregation can sing.
- Face masks remain mandatory.
- We will continue to postpone face-to-face gatherings in parish facilities other than the Place of Worship until after 15 December, or we reach a 95% double vaccination rate.

FEAST: St. Elizabeth of Hungary – 17th November

We have saints in the Church from all walks of life, even some who were of royal stock. St. Elizabeth of Hungary was the daughter of the King, who married nobility and had three children. She was inspired by the life and example of St. Francis of Assisi and decided to become a lay member of the Franciscan Order, dedicating her life to the care of the poor and sick in a hospice which she founded until her death. She is one of the patron saints of the Secular Franciscan Order.



So with you, when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. "Carrying out my call to love & serve at home"

I've always been taught of the importance in serving others. A spirit of service is such a valuable quality. Therefore, I have felt compelled to find my place in the world through some type of work of service (whether my immediate intention be selfish or not). I've always felt that unless I am serving others that I would not find true happiness/fulfilment. As a result, I embarked on my first service project in 2012 when I got the opportunity to go to the Philippines through school. This was an absolutely incredible experience which propelled my desire to take part in more service projects. I was blessed with the opportunity to go to Samoa in 2015, Jamaica in 2017 and Kenya and Uganda in 2019. Each of these experiences was invaluable and each experience definitely gave me the sense of fulfilment that I had been searching for. And at the risk of sounding cliché, I was always met with more love and generosity towards me from those that I was there to serve, than I could give them.

I was also blessed with the opportunity to find joy in service here in Australia through my day job at a children's charity (which I absolutely love).

But in my search for joy/fulfilment through service, I missed something so important. I have always looked for opportunities to serve beyond my home. I have been blind to the fact that service isn't just required to those who are visibly in need, but to those who may have all of their basic human needs met too. Service isn't just required to those outside of our family but sometimes the ones in need of greatest service are our families. I think I always knew this in the back of my mind, but I always chose to ignore it because it is easier to serve those who are visibly in need, those who are far from us, those who are not related to us. I have lost emotional sensitivity to the needs of those closest to me. It is easier to leave my home and embark on an idealistic tropic adventure in search of someone in need of service, rather than wake up in the morning and serve my family (where no one will see the good that I have done and where my acts of service may go unrecognised).

During the last few months, I have been forced to stop running away from the different needs within my home amongst the members of my family and to come face to face with them instead. I have no more excuses and no more opportunity to volunteer outside of home. As much as I want to run and not face the fact that I do not know how to serve my family, I can't.....I am trapped in my home with the reality that I need to love my family before I can give true and genuine love to those outside my family. This is where I am being called to serve in the church right now. It is difficult and I don't know how to swallow my pride and do it, but this is where I feel that God wants me to exercise true love right now.

Mother Teresa was right.......... "It is easy to love the people far away. It is not always easy to love those close to us. Bring love into your home, for this is where our love for each other must start."
