THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING WISDOM 12:13, 16-19

There is no god, other than you, who cares for everything, to whom you might have to prove that you never judged unjustly.

Your justice has its source in strength, your sovereignty over all makes you lenient to all.

You show your strength when your sovereign power is questioned and you expose the insolence of those who know it; but, disposing of such strength, you are mild in judgement, you govern us with great lenience, for you have only to will, and your power is there. By acting thus you have taught a lesson to your people

how the virtuous man must be kindly to his fellow men, and you have given your sons the good hope that after sin you will grant repentance.

The Spirit comes to help us in our weakness. 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GOSPEL MATTHEW 13:24-43

Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn."

He proposed another parable to them. "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that a person took and sowed in a field. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when full-grown it is the largest of plants. It becomes a large bush, and the 'birds of the sky come and dwell in its branches.' He spoke to them another parable.

"The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed with three measures of wheat flour until the whole batch was leavened." All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables. He spoke to them only in parables, to fulfill what had been said through the prophet: *I will open my mouth in parables ,I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world.*

Then, dismissing the crowds, he went into the house. His disciples approached him and said, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field." He said in reply, "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels.

Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all who cause others to sin and all evildoers.

They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

REFLECTION FOR 19TH JULY

The sower has sown good seed in his field for a healthy wheat harvest, but there are also weeds growing in the same patch. It resembles wheat but it is not. Like the disciples, instinctively, one would like to pull out the weeds growing with the wheat, but to do that would also risk damaging the wheat. Both need to co-exist for a while before the weeds can be pulled out. In our life we may encounter situations or people that we consider necessary to 'pull out'. How often do we want to get rid of what we consider the 'weeds' in our life: a person who disagrees with our way of thinking or the colleague at work who challenges us? How impatient are we even with ourselves to get rid of our failings? Nevertheless, Jesus wants us to understand that we need to learn to coexist with the 'weeds'. There will be a right time to separate the wheat from the weeds. How do I co-exist with what is unpleasant, disagreeable and in conflict with my personality? Am I patient in discerning the time I need to co-exist with these situations and people? How discerning am I to know when to separate from them?
